DEPARTMENTAL EXHIBITORS RULES AND REGULATIONS

The general supervision of the entire Puyallup Fair and Spring Fair in Puyallup, including all exhibits, entertainment and concessions, has been vested by the Western Washington Fair Association board of directors in the Chief Executive Officer of the Association.

1. The Association will have officers on the grounds and will use every reasonable precaution in its power for the preservation and protection of persons, articles on exhibition, entries, livestock and property, but will not be responsible for loss or damage by theft, fire or otherwise.

TRADEMARKS AND COPYRIGHTS

2. Certain words, slogans and graphic symbols have been established to represent the Puyallup Fair and the Spring Fair in Puyallup, and are the exclusive property of the Western Washington Fair Association. "The Spring Fair in Puyallup" and "The Puyallup Fair" are trade names registered with Washington's Secretary of State. Artwork, slogans, music and other communications created to promote or represent the Association or its annual fairs are likewise protected by law. This includes the phrase "Do the Puyallup" and the music and lyrics of the song, "Do the Puyallup," the wordmark combining "THE SPRING FAIR IN PUYALLUP" and "THE PUYALLUP FAIR" and other temporary slogans such as "It's Spring, Baby!", "Epic Fun" or "I Love This Fair."

The valuable trade names and protected slogans and symbols may not be used without the express written consent of the Fair. In general, permission is granted under license, i.e., for consideration, or by permission under special circumstances. Submit requests to the marketing manager, along with complete information on frequency and distribution, including examples or written description of the proposed use.

WHEN ADDRESSING CORRESPONDENCE TO THE FAIR, PLEASE NOTE DEPARTMENT TO WHICH IT BELONGS ON THE FACE OF THE ENVELOPE.

3. Exhibitors should check each department for specific entry information. Read the special rules and other information printed in connection with the classification and prize list in each department. Note the time set for the closing of entries.
4. Every animal or article must be entered in the name of the owner, maker or grower.

ANYONE TRYING TO DECEIVE THE COMMITTEE WITH REGARD TO OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBIT, OR WHO SHALL PURCHASE OR BORROW THEM AND EXHIBIT THEM AS OF HIS OR HER OWN MANUFACTURE OR PRODUCTION, SHALL FORFEIT ALL CLAIMS AS AN EXHIBITOR.
5. No "FOR SALE" cards will be allowed on exhibits, in the buildings, or on the grounds.
6. Fair management reserves the right to cancel any class without prior notice for reasons deemed advisable by Fair legal counsel and/or Fair veterinarian.

ARRIVAL TIME OF EXHIBITS

7. The Puyallup Fair will be open for the receiving of articles according to the specified rules governing individual departments.
8. EXHIBITS MUST BE IN PLACE AT 8:00 A.M. THE FIRST DAY OF THE FAIR UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED. CHECK EACH DEPARTMENT'S ENTRY INFORMATION FOR POSSIBLE EXCEPTIONS.

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

9. First premiums shall be designated by blue ribbons, second premiums by red ribbons, third premiums by white ribbons, fourth premiums by pink ribbons, and fifth premiums by yellow ribbons.

10. No animal or article shall be allowed to compete for more than one open class premium, nor shall it be entered in more than one class, except as one of a herd, pair or pen, fur or wool, get of sire or dam, or in sweepstakes or championship classes. However, 4-H and FFA exhibitors may also show their registered livestock in open classes, provided their entries are received by the closing date for entries in the open class, and providing there is no conflict in judging schedule with the junior show.
 11. No animal or article shall be removed from the Fair before the close of the Fair or show, except by special permission from the superintendent. Any animal or article taken away before the close of the Fair or show without the permission of the superintendent shall forfeit all premiums. LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS: SEE RULES IN REGARD TO SPLIT SHOWS UNDER SPECIFIC DEPARTMENTS.
 12. Unless otherwise stated by a specific department, in cases where exhibits are tied for prizes, awards shall be determined as follows:
 - A. If the premium is a trophy, medal or any other award except a cash prize, the exhibitors entering these exhibits shall draw lots, the winner being awarded the premium.
 - B. If the premium is a cash prize, the money shall be divided equally among the exhibitors concerned. The next lower cash premium, if any, offered in the class shall be added to the premium for which the entries are tied, and then the division shall be made equally.
 13. Cash prizes shall be paid to winners only in classes included in the judge's list.
 14. The judges shall report only the animals or articles entitled to premiums in the judge's list, though they may commend others they deem worthy. The superintendent may deny entry to any animal or exhibit he deems unworthy of public display.
 15. No animal or article deemed unworthy shall be awarded a premium. No premiums shall be withheld merely because there is no competition. Decision of the judge shall be final.
 16. No person shall be allowed to see the judging books until after the awards have been made and entered.
- interest in the result as owner or agent; and when awards have been made in violation of this rule Fair management reserves the right to appoint a new judge and to compel another examination.
18. Any person interfering with the judge during the adjudication of awards will forfeit the right of premiums. All officers or judges are required, and exhibitors are requested, to report any violation of this rule to the department superintendent.
 19. All protests must be made in writing, and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$25.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal, and must be filed with the Puyallup Fair Entry Office within 24 hours after the cause of protest.
 20. NO PERSON SHALL BE ALLOWED TO SELL OR GIVE AWAY ARTICLES ON THE GROUNDS, EITHER DURING THE FAIR OR AT ANY TIME BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE SAME, UNTIL THE LICENSE FOR THE PRIVILEGE SHALL HAVE BEEN PAID AND RECEIPT THEREFORE ISSUED. THIS INCLUDES BALLOONS OR OTHER NOVELTIES FOR WHICH THE FAIR CONTRACTS THE SALE PRIVILEGE.

PERSONALITY RIGHTS

Exhibitor hereby grants to Western Washington Fair Association ("WWFA") the irrevocable, assignable, worldwide right and license to use, alter and publish his/her image, alone or together with other images and text, for WWFA publications and for all other purposes reasonably related to promotion of WWFA, the Spring Fair in Puyallup and Puyallup Fair, in any manner and in any medium now known or later developed, without the need for exhibitor's prior approval. This right and license will govern all images of exhibitor, whether created before or after the date of these Rules and Regulations, unless exhibitor notifies WWFA in writing that of a desire to exclude specific images from this right and license. Exhibitor hereby releases the photographer and/or videographer and WWFA, its agents and assigns, from all claims and liability relating to the licenses that exhibitor has granted in this license and release. This license and release will not obligate WWFA to use or publish exhibitor's image or use the rights exhibitor has granted.

ELECTRICAL USAGE NOTICE

Electrical appliances which draw more than 200 watts and which are used for the personal convenience of exhibitors (kettles, coffee pots, space heaters, air conditioners, hot plates, etc.) are not allowed without permission. A costly power failure can result from overloading circuits.

NO COOKING OR EATING IS ALLOWED IN THE BARN.

PENALTIES AND PROTESTS

17. Fair management will appoint a superintendent and one or more judges for each division when deemed necessary. No person can act as a judge in any division or class in which there is any direct or indirect

VEHICLE UNLOADING PROCEDURES

The Puyallup Fair is continually striving to make setup of merchandise and animal exhibits safer and more efficient. We are asking for your full cooperation in this safety program. **If you do not need to drive onto the grounds, please park in a Fair parking lot and hand truck or walk in.** When you have to drive in and unload, do so as quickly as possible and exit.

Security Check

Each vehicle entering the grounds will be subject to search prior to entering the grounds. Please enter designated Security Checkpoint Staging Area located at the Service Gate area. Expect delays.

Service Gate

Enter to receive vehicle permit to unload on grounds. You will be allowed one hour to unload and exit the grounds. Your pass will be date/time stamped. If you absolutely cannot complete your unloading in one hour, you must get the pass validated by a department superintendent or an administrative person.

Traffic Pattern

Follow the traffic patterns as established. Surrender the vehicle permit at the time you exit the grounds.

Fine

If you take longer than one hour and do not have validation for an extension, there is a parking fine of \$10.00 per hour.

During Fair Time

Concessionaires and sponsors with vehicles will be allowed through the Service Gate between 6:00 am and 8:30 am with a Service Road Vehicle Permit. You will receive your gate permit from the attendant at the gate. **NO** vehicles are allowed through the gate after 8:30 am. All vehicles must be removed from the grounds by 9:00 am. Vehicles left unattended and without a permit for parking past the allotted time will either receive a warning and be asked to remove the vehicle from the grounds or be towed away at the owner's expense. Do not park in front of doorways or in vehicle traffic lanes. Your vehicle may be towed away. **HANG VEHICLE PERMIT ON THE REAR VIEW MIRROR SO YOU CAN BE FOUND IN AN EMERGENCY. Include the building where you can be located and your cell phone number.** Please unload quickly and remove your vehicle from the grounds. **NO KEYS ARE TO BE LEFT IN MOTORIZED VEHICLES ON DISPLAY.**

ENTRANCE TO THE PUYALLUP FAIR

PRIOR TO THE FAIR: The Floral Building is open to receive entries Thursday, September 10, 9 am to 8 pm. Automobile traffic: Enter at the Service Gate on 5th Street SW, off of 15th Avenue SW. See **Vehicle Unloading Procedures** on page 3. **All vehicles entering the grounds may be subject to search. Expect delays.** Pedestrian traffic may enter at Red Gate (9th Avenue SW and 4th Street SW).

DURING THE FAIR: The Floral Building is open to receive entries. Pedestrian traffic will be admitted free at Red Gate

when bringing entries. No entry tickets are given. Automobile traffic may enter at the Service Gate prior to 8:30 am. See **Vehicle Unloading Procedures** on page 3. All vehicles entering the grounds may be subject to search. Automobiles bearing exhibits to be shown in the Floral Department **WILL NOT BE ADMITTED TO THE GROUNDS AFTER 8:30 AM**, except with special permission of the Fair management. DURING THE FAIR, ALL VEHICLES MUST BE OFF THE GROUNDS BY 9 AM, OR THEY WILL BE TOWED. THERE IS NO PARKING AT RED GATE, ONLY UNLOADING. IF YOU PARK THERE, YOU MAY GET A TICKET FROM THE PUYALLUP POLICE.

EXHIBITS MUST REMAIN IN THE FLORAL BUILDING UNTIL MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 28. They can be picked up Monday, September 28 from 8 am to 8 pm, or Tuesday, September 29 from 9 am to Noon without a pass through the Red Gate.

The area in the west end of the Floral Building is available to exhibitors for a limited time to unload and load when moving materials. No parking is allowed except by permission of building superintendent.

EXPLANATION OF TERMS

Terms used in the following "Points for Judging" shall be interpreted as follows:

- Arrangement - Composition for harmony and effect in floral design
- Quality - Color, form and clearness in marking
- Condition - Development, freshness and substance
- Variety - Closely related group or assortment of plants
- Finish - Apparent quality of workmanship

JUNIOR FLORICULTURE DIVISION INFORMATION

Classes in this division will be open to anyone, five through 18 years of age who has grown his or her own entry.

All classifications will be judged Saturday, September 19. See classifications starting at 2800.

Junior Floriculture entries will be accepted for judging on Saturday, September 19, 6 am to 9 am. Exhibitors will be limited to three entries in each class, providing they are a different variety or color. Judging starts at 10:30 am. Premiums will be mailed to exhibitors. Ribbons must be picked up at the Floral Office.

The First Junior Rose Show will be held Sunday, September 13, the Second Junior Rose Show will be held on Sunday, September 20 and the third Junior Rose Show will be held on Saturday, September 26. See separate division for juniors, open to anyone five through 18 years old, starting with Class 2570, 5570 and 6570.

JUDGING

Judging will begin as shown under division headings.

NO exhibitors will be allowed in the building during judging.

EXHIBITOR RULES

- All exhibits must be in place by 9 am on the day of judging.
- Exhibitors are limited to three entries in any class, except orchids, and where noted. **Premiums will be awarded to first and second place only.**
- Ribbons will be awarded to winners of first, second and third prizes in this department. **If you win rosettes or ribbons, be sure to pick them up during the Fair, or the Monday after the Fair since none will be mailed to exhibitors.**

4. Cash premiums will be paid only for the classes listed in this premium list. Premiums will be mailed around the middle of October.
5. When there are many entries in a class, there may be a sub-class with premiums. **The class may not be divided into more than five sub-classes, and there must be at least three entries in the sub-class.**
6. All plant material entered should have the common name and the botanical name on the entry tag. No exhibit may be entered in "Any Other Class" if there is a class for the exhibit.
7. An exhibitor may enter in only one of the following divisions: Novice, Amateur, or Professional. If it is determined that a crossover has occurred, all awards will be forfeited.

Schedules may be divided into four classes (except where noted).

- Classes for Juniors/Youth
- Classes for Novices
- Classes for Amateurs
- Classes for Professional and/or Commercial

A junior/youth shall be five through 18 years of age.

A Novice is a person who is inexperienced in the showing of a specific flower. See ruling in each flower division as to how long an exhibitor can stay in Novice division.

An amateur is a person who grows plants for their own use and enjoyment, and not for the purpose of gaining a profit.

A Professional and/or Commercial exhibitor is a person who maintains a garden or other horticultural establishment for the purpose of gaining a profit, or a person who engages in activity for such a garden or establishment for compensation, or has had previous qualifications as a professional.

8. No cut flowers will be saved and returned to exhibitors. Cut flowers must be displayed in containers furnished by the Fair, unless otherwise specified in the schedule.
9. EXHIBITS MUST REMAIN IN THE FLORAL BUILDING UNTIL MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 28. They can be picked up Monday, September 28 from 8 am to 8 pm, or Tuesday, September 29 from 9 am to Noon, without a pass, through the Red Gate.
10. Baskets and containers must be clean, neat and in good condition. ALL BASKETS MUST HAVE FIXED HANDLES. HANGING BASKETS MUST HAVE HANGING APPARATUS ATTACHED.

11. Any plant material found having insects or disease will be put in quarantine and must be removed from the grounds within six hours after notification. After that time, the item will be destroyed.
12. Any ribbon or premium corrections must be reported within 90 days to the superintendent.

INDOOR POTTED PLANT DIVISION

Entries may be made Thursday, September 10 from 9 am to 8 pm, or Friday, September 11 from 6 am to 9 am. No entries accepted on Saturday. **Each exhibitor is limited to three entries in each class, providing they are of a different variety or color.** Name of variety should be on entry tag. This division is not open to professional or commercial growers.

Plants must be entered under correct classification where specific names of plants or plant families are given. Containers must not exceed 18" in diameter, must not weigh over 20 pounds, and must be clean. Plants not entered properly will be changed at the judges' discretion. Watering instructions must be written on back of exhibit tag. Please mark your pot with your name. Plants must be transportable by one person, and hanging plants must not exceed 8'. **Typical outdoor grown plants are not allowed.**

Judging will be on show day, Saturday, September 12. Hanging baskets must have hanging apparatus attached. NO exhibitor will be allowed in the building during judging. Entries may not be removed before Monday, September 28. For removal days, see Exhibitor Rules, pages 5-6.

All fresh flower designs must have suitable container to hold water.

The Fair will exercise all care possible but cannot be held responsible for loss, damage, and/or injury to property or persons. Please mark all property with name.

Exhibitors will be divided according to their experience. Y - YOUTH: Ages five through 18; N - NOVICE: One who has never won more than three blue ribbons in design in any show. A - AMATEUR: One who has won four to 15 blue ribbons in design in any show. AA - ADVANCED AMATEUR: One who has won 16 to 30 blue ribbons in design in any show. AAA - ADVANCED AMATEUR: One who has won more than 30 blue ribbons in design in any show.

FLORIST'S DIVISION

Display setup time is 6 am to 9 am the morning of your display date. Removal time is from 9 pm to 10 pm on your last display date. You may use the back gate of the Floral Building (west end) for loading and unloading. There is a one hour time limit for use of this gate. **PLEASE SEE VEHICLE UNLOADING PROCEDURES ON PAGE 3.**

Booth size is 8' tall, 8' long and 7' wide. The designer must furnish all properties. There should be at least five designs. Two may be silk or dried. Use a minimum of fresh potted plants to fill in empty spaces. You may use any theme.

Business signs may not exceed 2' x 4'. Business cards may be no larger than 2" x 4".

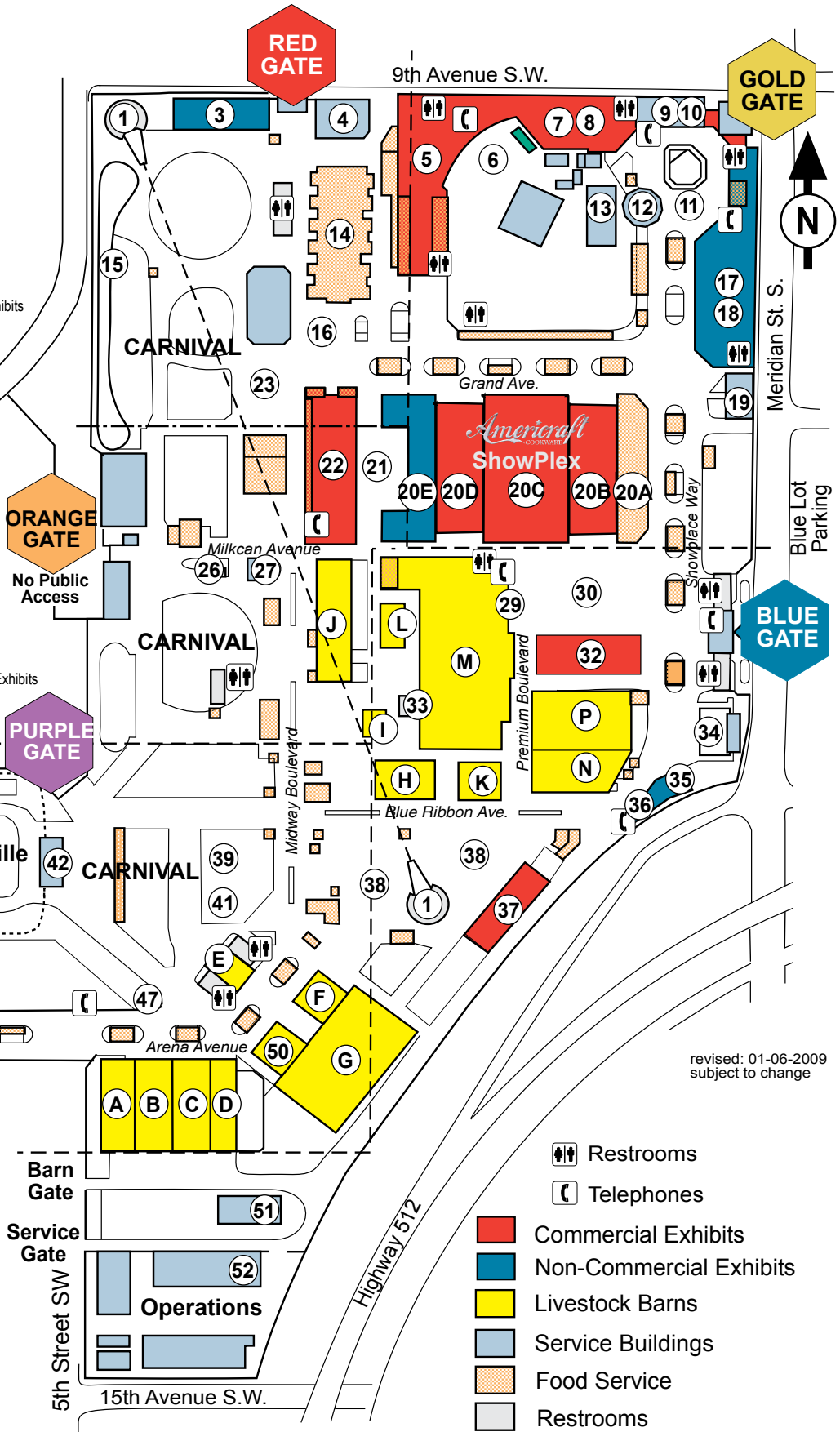
