DEPARTMENTAL EXHIBITORS RULES AND REGULATIONS

The general supervision of the entire Puyallup Fair and Spring Fair in Puyallup, including all exhibits, entertainment and concessions, has been vested by the Western Washington Fair Association board of directors in the Chief Executive Officer of the Association.

1. The Association will have officers on the grounds and will use every reasonable precaution in its power for the preservation and protection of persons, articles on exhibition, entries, livestock and property, but will not be responsible for loss or damage by theft, fire or otherwise.

TRADEMARKS AND COPYRIGHTS

2. Certain words, slogans and graphic symbols have been established to represent the Puyallup Fair and the Spring Fair in Puyallup, and are the exclusive property of the Western Washington Fair Association. "The Spring Fair in Puyallup" and "The Puyallup Fair" are trade names registered with Washington's Secretary of State. Artwork, slogans, music and other communications created to promote or represent the Association or its annual fairs are likewise protected by law. This includes the phrase "Do the Puyallup" and the music and lyrics of the song, "Do the Puyallup," the wordmark combining "THE SPRING FAIR IN PUYALLUP" and "THE PUYALLUP FAIR" and other temporary slogans such as "It's Spring, Baby!", "Epic Fun" or "I Love This Fair."

The valuable trade names and protected slogans and symbols may not be used without the express written consent of the Fair. In general, permission is granted under license, i.e., for consideration, or by permission under special circumstances. Submit requests to the marketing manager, along with complete information on frequency and distribution, including examples or written description of the proposed use.

WHEN ADDRESSING CORRESPONDENCE TO THE FAIR, PLEASE NOTE DEPARTMENT TO WHICH IT BELONGS ON THE FACE OF THE ENVELOPE.

3. Exhibitors should check each department for specific entry information. Read the special rules and other information printed in connection with the classification and prize list in each department. Note the time set for the closing of entries.
4. Every animal or article must be entered in the name of the owner, maker or grower.

ANYONE TRYING TO DECEIVE THE COMMITTEE WITH REGARD TO OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBIT, OR WHO SHALL PURCHASE OR BORROW THEM AND EXHIBIT THEM AS OF HIS OR HER OWN MANUFACTURE OR PRODUCTION, SHALL FORFEIT ALL CLAIMS AS AN EXHIBITOR.
5. No "FOR SALE" cards will be allowed on exhibits, in the buildings, or on the grounds.
6. Fair management reserves the right to cancel any class without prior notice for reasons deemed advisable by Fair legal counsel and/or Fair veterinarian.

ARRIVAL TIME OF EXHIBITS

7. The Puyallup Fair will be open for the receiving of articles according to the specified rules governing individual departments.
8. EXHIBITS MUST BE IN PLACE AT 8:00 A.M. THE FIRST DAY OF THE FAIR UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED. CHECK EACH DEPARTMENT'S ENTRY INFORMATION FOR POSSIBLE EXCEPTIONS.

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

9. First premiums shall be designated by blue ribbons, second premiums by red ribbons, third premiums by white ribbons, fourth premiums by pink ribbons, and fifth premiums by yellow ribbons.

10. No animal or article shall be allowed to compete for more than one open class premium, nor shall it be entered in more than one class, except as one of a herd, pair or pen, fur or wool, get of sire or dam, or in sweepstakes or championship classes. However, 4-H and FFA exhibitors may also show their registered livestock in open classes, provided their entries are received by the closing date for entries in the open class, and providing there is no conflict in judging schedule with the junior show.
 11. No animal or article shall be removed from the Fair before the close of the Fair or show, except by special permission from the superintendent. Any animal or article taken away before the close of the Fair or show without the permission of the superintendent shall forfeit all premiums. LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS: SEE RULES IN REGARD TO SPLIT SHOWS UNDER SPECIFIC DEPARTMENTS.
 12. Unless otherwise stated by a specific department, in cases where exhibits are tied for prizes, awards shall be determined as follows:
 - A. If the premium is a trophy, medal or any other award except a cash prize, the exhibitors entering these exhibits shall draw lots, the winner being awarded the premium.
 - B. If the premium is a cash prize, the money shall be divided equally among the exhibitors concerned. The next lower cash premium, if any, offered in the class shall be added to the premium for which the entries are tied, and then the division shall be made equally.
 13. Cash prizes shall be paid to winners only in classes included in the judge's list.
 14. The judges shall report only the animals or articles entitled to premiums in the judge's list, though they may commend others they deem worthy. The superintendent may deny entry to any animal or exhibit he deems unworthy of public display.
 15. No animal or article deemed unworthy shall be awarded a premium. No premiums shall be withheld merely because there is no competition. Decision of the judge shall be final.
 16. No person shall be allowed to see the judging books until after the awards have been made and entered.
- interest in the result as owner or agent; and when awards have been made in violation of this rule Fair management reserves the right to appoint a new judge and to compel another examination.
18. Any person interfering with the judge during the adjudication of awards will forfeit the right of premiums. All officers or judges are required, and exhibitors are requested, to report any violation of this rule to the department superintendent.
 19. All protests must be made in writing, and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$25.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal, and must be filed with the Puyallup Fair Entry Office within 24 hours after the cause of protest.
 20. NO PERSON SHALL BE ALLOWED TO SELL OR GIVE AWAY ARTICLES ON THE GROUNDS, EITHER DURING THE FAIR OR AT ANY TIME BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE SAME, UNTIL THE LICENSE FOR THE PRIVILEGE SHALL HAVE BEEN PAID AND RECEIPT THEREFORE ISSUED. THIS INCLUDES BALLOONS OR OTHER NOVELTIES FOR WHICH THE FAIR CONTRACTS THE SALE PRIVILEGE.

PERSONALITY RIGHTS

Exhibitor hereby grants to Western Washington Fair Association ("WWFA") the irrevocable, assignable, worldwide right and license to use, alter and publish his/her image, alone or together with other images and text, for WWFA publications and for all other purposes reasonably related to promotion of WWFA, the Spring Fair in Puyallup and Puyallup Fair, in any manner and in any medium now known or later developed, without the need for exhibitor's prior approval. This right and license will govern all images of exhibitor, whether created before or after the date of these Rules and Regulations, unless exhibitor notifies WWFA in writing that of a desire to exclude specific images from this right and license. Exhibitor hereby releases the photographer and/or videographer and WWFA, its agents and assigns, from all claims and liability relating to the licenses that exhibitor has granted in this license and release. This license and release will not obligate WWFA to use or publish exhibitor's image or use the rights exhibitor has granted.

ELECTRICAL USAGE NOTICE

Electrical appliances which draw more than 200 watts and which are used for the personal convenience of exhibitors (kettles, coffee pots, space heaters, air conditioners, hot plates, etc.) are not allowed without permission. A costly power failure can result from overloading circuits.

NO COOKING OR EATING IS ALLOWED IN THE BARN.

PENALTIES AND PROTESTS

17. Fair management will appoint a superintendent and one or more judges for each division when deemed necessary. No person can act as a judge in any division or class in which there is any direct or indirect

VEHICLE UNLOADING PROCEDURES

The Puyallup Fair is continually striving to make setup of merchandise and animal exhibits safer and more efficient. We are asking for your full cooperation in this safety program. **If you do not need to drive onto the grounds, please park in a Fair parking lot and hand truck or walk in.** When you have to drive in and unload, do so as quickly as possible and exit.

Security Check

Each vehicle entering the grounds will be subject to search prior to entering the grounds. Please enter designated Security Checkpoint Staging Area located at the Service Gate area. Expect delays.

Service Gate

Enter to receive vehicle permit to unload on grounds. You will be allowed one hour to unload and exit the grounds. Your pass will be date/time stamped. If you absolutely cannot complete your unloading in one hour, you must get the pass validated by a department superintendent or an administrative person.

Traffic Pattern

Follow the traffic patterns as established. Surrender the vehicle permit at the time you exit the grounds.

Fine

If you take longer than one hour and do not have validation for an extension, there is a parking fine of \$10.00 per hour.

During Fair Time

Concessionaires and sponsors with vehicles will be allowed through the Service Gate between 6:00 am and 8:30 am with a Service Road Vehicle Permit. You will receive your gate permit from the attendant at the gate. **NO** vehicles are allowed through the gate after 8:30 am. All vehicles must be removed from the grounds by 9:00 am. Vehicles left unattended and without a permit for parking past the allotted time will either receive a warning and be asked to remove the vehicle from the grounds or be towed away at the owner's expense. Do not park in front of doorways or in vehicle traffic lanes. Your vehicle may be towed away. **HANG VEHICLE PERMIT ON THE REAR VIEW MIRROR SO YOU CAN BE FOUND IN AN EMERGENCY. Include the building where you can be located and your cell phone number.** Please unload quickly and remove your vehicle from the grounds. **NO KEYS ARE TO BE LEFT IN MOTORIZED VEHICLES ON DISPLAY.**

HOBBY HALL ENTRY SCHEDULE

ENTRY DATES AND TIMES

- Trim-a-Christmas-Tree participants must pre-register by August 1 using the form on page 29. All entries will be put in a drawing and eight will be selected by August 6. You will be notified by August 15 if your entry has been drawn.

PLEASE NOTE ENTRY DATES

- You may drive to the Hobby Hall through the Service Gate at 5th Street SW (off of 15th Avenue SW) on all three entry days, or you may walk through the Gold Gate entrance off Meridian Street S at 9th Avenue.

- Exhibitors in Divisions A through Z must bring their entries to the Hobby Hall on Friday, August 28, between the hours of 9 am and 4 pm, on Saturday, August 29 between the hours of 9 am and 4 pm, or on Sunday, August 30 between the hours of noon and 6 pm. Entry forms will be filled out at the time of entry.
- Doll House Exhibitors – please contact the Hobby Hall office, (253) 841-5062 between August 1 and August 21 – Monday through Friday, 9 am to noon to pre-register the size of your doll house – no size limit.

WAYS TO PARTICIPATE

The Hobby Hall offers a place for amateur crafts persons, collectors and hobbyists to meet and display their crafts.

This department consists of four separate divisions; Entries, Collections, Demonstrations, and Group or Club participation. You may participate by:

- A. ENTERING YOUR HAND-CRAFTED ITEMS For all entries in Division A through Z, bring your items to the Hobby Hall on Friday, August 28 between 9 am and 4 pm, on Saturday, August 29 between 9 am and 4 pm, or on Sunday, August 30 between noon and 6 pm.
 - There is no entry fee or pre-registration, except for Miniature Doll Houses and Trim-A-Tree.
 - Doll House makers must pre-register the size of their doll house between August 1 and August 26.
 - Trim-A-Christmas-Tree Contest must pre-register by August 1 using the form on page 29.
 - Items will be judged; then displayed during the Fair. Return dates are Tuesday, Sept. 29, 9 am – 8 pm, and Wednesday, Sept. 30, 9 am – 6 pm. Please read Hobby Hall class and entry information.
- B. DISPLAYING YOUR COLLECTION - Share your collection with Fair guests.
 - There is no entry fee.
 - Must be by application only. Photos of collection must accompany application.
 - See information on page 30 and COLLECTIONS APPLICATION on page 31 of this book.
 - Applications are due by August 1, 2009.
- C. DEMONSTRATING YOUR CRAFT - Demonstrate your craft or hobby to Fair guests.
 - Passes will be given to demonstrators.
 - If interested in demonstrating your craft or hobby, contact: Marilyn Fankhauser - Hobby Hall Demonstrations, 110 9th Avenue SW, Puyallup, WA 98371 or call: (253) 841-5074.
 - During the Fair, craftspersons demonstrate their skills from 11 am to 9 pm daily
- D. YOUR GROUP OR CLUB SHARING YOUR HOBBY WITH THE PUBLIC - Share the joy of your craft or hobby with Fair guests, and encourage interest in membership in your group or club.

HOBBY HALL ENTRIES RULES

AWARDS

Each division having at least three exhibitors will have a purple and gold Grand Champion rosette and prize awarded to the most outstanding entry of that division. A lavender and white Reserve Champion Rosette will also be given in each qualifying division. There may be one Blue, (1st), one Red (2nd) and one White (3rd) ribbon given in each class. Premiums will be awarded as listed for each division. Other awards will include Honorable Mention, Merit, and Special Awards. With the exception of Trim-a-Christmas-Tree Contest, only Purple, Lavender, Blue and Red ribbons will receive money or prize premiums. A Peoples' Choice ribbon is awarded daily in both Adult and Junior Collections. NO ENTRY FEE WILL BE CHARGED.

ABSOLUTELY NO INFORMATION ON PLACINGS OR AWARDS WILL BE GIVEN PRIOR TO FAIR'S OPENING.

If you have WON the Grand Champion for two consecutive years in a Division, you will not be allowed to enter that division for one calendar year.

DISPLAYS

All award-winning entries will be displayed, and every effort will be made to display all other entries. However,

we reserve the right to withhold non-award winning entries from display. The Fair reserves the right to remove any material from any exhibit that might be objectionable. Items not displayed will be held in a secure storage area and the entrant will be called prior to the Fair opening.

JUDGING

Judges are selected from professionals or highly accredited amateur artists working within their field of expertise. Employees of the Hobby Hall are not eligible to judge.

RECEIVING AND RETURN DATES

Entries and collections may be made through the Gold (walk in) or Service Gate (drive in). Please refer to the Entry and Return Schedule on page 4 for receiving and return dates and times.

HOBBY HALL ENTRIES

The general rules (Rules and Regulations) governing all departments of the Fair are to be observed with a few additions.

1. Mail-in entries will not be accepted, except the Trim-a-Christmas-Tree Contest.
2. No entry fees will be charged.
3. All articles must be the handwork of an individual exhibitor. They must be finished within the last two years. No article can be exhibited a second year. SOILED OR OBVIOUSLY USED ITEMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
4. Employees in the Hobby Hall are not allowed to enter articles for premiums.
5. ALL ITEMS WILL BE PLACED IN THE MOST SUITABLE CLASS. Each entrant shall be limited to ONE ENTRY PER CLASS, as to enter more would in effect be competing against oneself; i.e., one doll house, one doll house accessory. Entries may be reclassified by staff or judges. No pairs or sets will be accepted (except jewelry).
6. The "OTHER" class will only be used if the item does not fit within any other class in a division.
7. All awards need not necessarily be awarded in each class at the discretion of the judge.
8. The Hobby Hall is mainly for amateur craftspersons to compete and exhibit their work. Anyone who makes more than \$2,000 per year from the sale of the judged craft item, who teaches or has a teaching certificate for that craft, or who demonstrates that craft where supplies or finished works are sold is considered a professional by the Puyallup Fair. Divisions for teachers and

professionals are being offered for Woodcarving, Decorative Arts, Calligraphy, Hand Painted China, Teddy Bears, Leather Craft and Jewelry. **If you have WON the Grand Champion for two consecutive years in a division, you will not be allowed to enter that division for one calendar year.**

9. Junior divisions are offered in Operating Models, Jewelry, Woodworking, Leather Craft, Static Models, Scrapbooking, and Ceramics.
10. No pre-registration is required (except for Trim-A-Christmas-Tree Contest and Doll House).
11. All items placed on display must remain for the full length of the Fair.
12. The Puyallup Fair assumes no responsibility for loss or damage. Every reasonable precaution will be used to protect items on display.
13. No "For Sale" cards will be allowed on exhibits or in the building.

DIVISION A: WOODCARVING

You may drive to the Hobby Hall through the Service Gate at 5th Street SW (off 15th Avenue SW) on all three entry days, or you may walk through the Gold Gate entrance off Meridian Street S / 9th Avenue SW.

Entry dates for this Division are Friday, August 28, between the hours of 9 am and 4 pm, on Saturday, August 29 between the hours of 9 am and 4 pm, or on Sunday, August 30 between the hours of noon and 6 pm. Entry forms will be filled out at the time of entry.

Return dates are Tuesday, September 29, 9 am to 8 pm, and Wednesday, September 30, 9 am to 6 pm.

Please read the General Rules on page 1 and 2, and Hobby Hall Entries rules on pages 5-6.

If you have WON the Grand Champion in this division within the last five years, you must compete in the Teacher/Professional Division.

All articles must be the handwork of the exhibitor and finished within the last two years.

The "OTHER" class will only be used if the item does not fit within any other class in this division.

Also, see the Wood Sculpture information in the Fine Arts Department.

All plaques must have strong WIRE hangers, no string or self-leveling hangers (ex. _/_/_/_). Plaques may be up to 60" **width** and **length** combined. No pairs or sets will be accepted.

Some things judges consider:

Carving Skill: Carving intricacy and difficulty of carving, clean cuts, surface condition, execution of details; **Finish:** Appropriateness of finish, skill and quality in finishing; **Artistry:** Perspective, form, proportion, balance, dramatic impact, and originality in interpretation of subject. Use of grain, color, knots, etc., to enhance the carving's appeal; **General Impression:** Overall effect, impact and intrinsic value.
