Open Class Sheep entry forms are due and must be post-marked no later than midnight on Friday, July 16, 2010. The last date for refund of entry fees is August 27, 2010. After that date a written statement citing health reasons must be provided by a veterinarian for a refund.

"THE PUYALLUP CUPS"

These perpetual trophies will be awarded to the exhibitors who show the best young wool breed flock and the best young meat breed flock at the Puyallup Fair. The Puyallup Cup event will be 4 pm Sunday, September 26, 2010.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD

A premier exhibitor award will be given in breeds with at least two exhibitors entered in their division, with at least 10 head. The winner will be determined by the amount of prize money accumulated by the exhibitor's six highest placings in individual classes in that division.

SHEPHERD'S AWARD

In order to reinforce pride in the quality of the open sheep exhibit, the Puyallup Fair offers an appropriate award to the exhibitor in each sheep barn who is judged by Fair staff, using the following guidelines, to best promote the sheep industry.

Specific points for judging the Shepherd's Award:

1. Courtesy to the public and to Fair management.
2. Cooperation with other exhibitors.
3. Neat appearance of attendants.
4. Sheep kept properly fitted.
5. Sheep fed and watered regularly.
6. Pens kept clean and dry.
7. Aisles kept clean and open.
8. Educational value of exhibit.
9. Feed and equipment stowed neatly.
10. Promptness in show ring.

SHEEP SHOW RULES

1. Entry fee must accompany entry (\$5 per head). Entries are accepted by stamped date and by available space. Late entries will be considered on a case-by-case basis as space allows.

ANY CHANGE IN ENTRIES MUST BE MADE WITH THE SUPERINTENDENT BEFORE THE DAY OF SHOWING. SUBSTITUTIONS MAY BE MADE ONLY WITHIN THE SAME BREED AND CLASS.

2. All out-of-state sheep and goats are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, and all rams require an entry permit number. All sheep must have official scrapie identification. Sheep from Oregon and Idaho on a round trip of 96 hours or less are exempt from the requirement of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, provided the Fair management furnishes veterinary inspection on arrival and rejects any unhealthy animals. For stays longer than 96 hours, they must meet the Washington state import requirements.

All animals must meet Fair health requirements. Fair veterinary personnel will examine all entries and exhibition animals to insure freedom from ectoparasites and symptoms of contagious or infectious diseases before animals are penned. Blankets/Covers on sheep must be removed for veterinary inspection.

Please see the veterinary regulations for out-of-state **exhibitors** in the front of this book (pages 4-7).

3. Animals are to be delivered to assigned pens **between noon and 8 pm on Wednesday, September 22, 2010. Any late arrivals must be cleared with the superintendent, or space will be forfeited at 8 pm. Please call the Fair's Entry Office, (253) 841-5017 if you will be late.**
 4. Sheep must be removed from pens after 10 pm on Sunday, September 26, 2010 or on Monday, September 27, 2010. Animals must be removed from pens by noon on Monday. Any arrangements made by exhibitors for sale or delivery of animals must be transacted off the grounds, and sheep cannot be left in pens for pick up.
- Please... Check your registration papers with the superintendent or staff AS SOON AS YOUR SHEEP ARE STABLED.**
5. Straw for bedding and hay will be provided by the Puyallup Fair. First straw will be in the barn. The hay and straw storage shed will not be open to exhibitors.

NOTE:

The superintendent recommends exhibitors bring first night's feed with them. Please order hay and

straw in writing from your superintendent before 6 pm for the following morning's requirements. Hay and straw bales shall not be used for purposes other than feed and bedding.

6. Exhibitors will receive four one-day gate passes for each five head entered.
7. SHEEP MAY NOT BE BLANKETED BETWEEN 9 AM AND 10 PM, EXCEPT BEFORE THEY ARE SHOWN.
8. All sheep and goats (including lambs and kids over 90 days) must be registered by the appropriate association and have ownership recorded in the name of the exhibitor no less than 30 days before show date. ALL ENTRIES MUST HAVE THE EAR TAG OF THE BREED ASSOCIATION IN EAR.
9. Animals must be entered and shown in the name of the registered owner.
10. There will be a limit of two premiums in the individual classes, and one premium in the group classes, per exhibitor. An exhibitor is defined as any individual or farm or partnership in whose name the sheep is registered.
11. The base date for birth dates shall be September 1. Animals must show appropriate lamb or yearling teeth. If there is a doubt of the age of any animal, the judge will decide age by examining the teeth of that animal.
12. LAMBS WILL BE DIVIDED INTO FALL AND SPRING DIVISIONS, EXCEPT WHERE NOTED (i.e. Specials). DATES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

For the following breeds:

Columbia - Corriedale - Dorset - Shropshire
Hampshire - Rambouillet - Suffolk

Fall Lambs: September 1 to December 31

Spring Lambs: January 1 to August 31

All other breeds are:

Fall Lambs: September 1 to January 31

Spring Lambs: February 1 to August 31

An individual exhibitor may enter a total of eight sheep per breed, whatever sex or age; lamb or yearling.

13. All sheep and goats entered in flock, get, or pair lots must also be entered in an individual lot. Get of Sire and Young Flock must be bred and owned by the exhibitor. One "BEST PAIR" entry per exhibitor.
14. Any breed with only one exhibitor will automatically go into Division 3400 "OTHER WOOL BREEDS" or Division 6000 "OTHER MEAT BREEDS". If two or more exhibitors of a breed are entered in Division 3400 or 6000, with a total of at least 10 head, they will form their own division. PLEASE CHECK POSTED SHOW SCHEDULE TO CONFIRM WHEN 'OTHER' BREEDS ARE TO BE SHOWN.

15. PLEASE NOTE: NCWGA has Class Divisions A & B. Animals for group classes may not be interchanged between divisions A and B to create a Best Pair, Young Flock, Flock, etc. They must be shown in the division in which the individual animal was entered.
16. All sheep and goats should be clean and well fitted. **Animals should be fit in accordance with individual registry association rules.** Animals not in show-worthy condition will not be allowed in the barn.
17. All judges' decisions will be final. Judges may disqualify any entry for just cause, and may reassign entries to categories as seem proper to the judge.
18. Winners of "Young Flock" must show in the competition for the Puyallup Cup.
19. **It is mandatory that exhibitors wear the proper ring number card while showing an animal in the ring. Please check in with the ring steward before entering the ring to make sure the proper card is displayed.**
20. Open class exhibitors must make their own arrangements for accommodations.
21. **Animals may not be walked on or off the grounds** because of serious environmental concerns directly related to animal waste. Any animal (except horses) that cannot be transported in a solid bottom carrier must be removed in a truck, trailer, or similar conveyance.
22. **Eating in the barns vs. E. coli O157:H7 – Exhibitor Cooperation Needed.**

Again this year our barns will not only have signage reminding Fair guests to "Wash your hands upon leaving any livestock area", but also "Please refrain from eating in livestock areas".

The State Health Department has asked the Fair to request that our livestock exhibitors set an example for Fair guests and refrain from eating in most areas of the barns. In order to accommodate the Health Department's request, as well as address our exhibitors' needs, we have set aside an area, screened from public view, in the south end of the Dairy Barn for exhibitors to eat.

FLEECE SHOW RULES

1. Fleeces must be delivered to the south end of Barn M (Dairy Barn) between 8 am and noon on Thursday, Sept. 23, 2010. Attendant will give exhibitor an entry tag for each class. THESE MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE THE FLEECE WILL BE ACCEPTED.
2. Fleeces must remain on display until release time – 8 pm on Sunday, September 26. Fleeces may remain until noon on Monday, September 27. The Fair will not be responsible for fleeces after that time.
3. Fleece must be shorn from sheep and goats owned by the exhibitor.
4. Fleeces shall not be more than 12 months growth. The definition of 12 months shall be the definition commonly accepted by the wool trade.
5. Exhibitors are limited to winning two premiums per section, and limited to entering a total of four breed classes.
6. Ram or wether fleeces may be shown in designated classes and commercial class.
7. Fleeces may not be tied. Present the fleece in large, clear plastic bags with no tears.
8. Natural colored fleeces entered in breed classes 1001 and 1003 cannot also be entered in the natural colored fleece classes 3001, 3003 and 3004. Colored fleece will be judged according to criteria established by the Natural Colored Wool Growers Association.
9. All judges' decisions will be final. Judges may disqualify any entry for just cause, and may reassign entries to categories, as seem proper.

A trophy will be awarded for first place in each class. The object of this activity is to give spectators an opportunity to see beautifully fitted sheep displayed along with garments of wool attractively worn by individuals, improve the image of sheep, and promote wool. Sheep must be either ewe lambs or yearling ewes, and must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show on a halter. The sheep must be shown in her appropriate class in the Open Sheep Show, 4-H Sheep Show, or FFA Sheep Show, and may be shown only once in the Lads and Ladies Lead Classes. Only the entrant will handle their sheep.

LADS & LADIES LEAD RULES

- Entrants must wear a casual or formal garment (not a costume), made of no less than 70% wool. Entries shall include a description of the garment to be worn, the background of contestant, and the breed of sheep (maximum of 150 words, please). This description will be read aloud as written, as the contestant and his/her animal promenade the ring.
- The entrant will be judged as follows:
One-third on the garment; one-third on the handling/appearance of the sheep; one-third on overall image.

In case of a tie, creativity and originality will be given emphasis.
- Entries and descriptions, including age (except adult) and address of contestant must be submitted to the open class sheep show office the day prior to the contest.
