# DEPARTMENTAL EXHIBITORS RULES AND REGULATIONS

The general supervision of the entire Puyallup Fair, including all exhibits, entertainment and concessions, has been vested in the manager of the Association by the Western Washington Fair board of directors.

1. The Association will have officers on the grounds and will use every reasonable precaution in its power for the preservation and protection of persons, articles on exhibition, livestock and property; but will not be responsible for loss or damage by theft, fire or otherwise.

## TRADEMARKS AND COPYRIGHTS

2. Certain words, slogans and graphic symbols have been established to represent the Puyallup Fair, and are the exclusive property of the Western Washington Fair Association. "The Puyallup Fair" is a trade name registered with Washington's Secretary of State. Artwork, slogans, music and other communications created to promote or represent the Association or its annual fairs are likewise protected by law. This includes the phrase "Do the Puyallup" and the music and lyrics of the song, "Do the Puyallup," the wordmark combining "THE PUYALLUP FAIR" with or without cow heads and other temporary slogans such as "Epic Fun," "I Love This Fair" or "Come Together".

The valuable trade names and protected slogans and symbols may not be used without the express written consent of the Fair. In general, permission is granted under license, i.e., for consideration, or by permission under special circumstances. Submit requests to the marketing manager, along with complete information on frequency and distribution, including examples or written description of the proposed use.

3. EXHIBITS MUST BE IN PLACE AT 8:00 A.M. THE FIRST DAY OF THE FAIR. CHECK EACH DEPARTMENT FOR POSSIBLE EXCEPTIONS.
4. The Western Washington Fair Association assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to entries. Every reasonable precaution will be used to protect items on display.

WHEN ADDRESSING CORRESPONDENCE TO THE FAIR, PLEASE NOTE DEPARTMENT TO WHICH IT BELONGS ON THE FACE OF THE ENVELOPE.

Read the special rules and other information printed in connection with the classification and prize list in each department. Note the time set for the closing of entries.

6. Every animal or article must be entered in the name of the owner, maker or grower.

ANYONE TRYING TO DECEIVE THE COMMITTEE WITH REGARD TO OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBIT, OR WHO SHALL PURCHASE OR BORROW THEM AND EXHIBIT THEM AS OF HIS OR HER OWN MANUFACTURE OR PRODUCTION, SHALL FORFEIT ALL CLAIMS AS AN EXHIBITOR.

7. No "FOR SALE" cards will be allowed on exhibits, in the buildings, or on the grounds.
8. Fair management reserves the right to cancel any class without prior notice for reasons deemed advisable by Fair legal counsel and/or Fair veterinarian.

## **ARRIVAL TIME OF EXHIBITS**

9. The Puyallup Fair will be open for the receiving of articles according to the specified rules governing individual departments.

## **PREMIUMS AND AWARDS**

10. First premiums shall be designated by blue ribbons, second premiums by red ribbons, third premiums by white ribbons, fourth premiums by pink ribbons, and fifth premiums by yellow ribbons.
11. No animal or article shall be allowed to compete for more than one open class premium, nor shall it be entered in more than one class, except as one of a herd, pair or pen, fur or wool, get of sire or dam, or in sweepstakes or championship classes. However, 4-H and FFA exhibitors may also show their registered livestock in open classes provided their entries are received by the closing date for entries in the open class, and providing there is no conflict in judging schedule with the junior show.
12. No animal or article shall be removed from the Fair before the close of the Fair except by special permission from the manager. Any animal or article taken away before the close of the Fair, without the permission of the manager, shall forfeit all premiums. **LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS: SEE RULES IN REGARD TO SPLIT SHOWS UNDER SPECIFIC DEPARTMENTS.**
13. Unless otherwise stated by a specific department, in cases where exhibits are tied for prizes, awards shall be determined as follows:
  - A. If the premium is a trophy, medal or any other award except a cash prize, the exhibitors entering these exhibits shall draw lots, the winner being awarded the premium.
  - B. If the premium is a cash prize, the money shall be divided equally among the exhibitors concerned. The next lower cash premium, if any, offered in the class shall be added to the premium for which the entries are tied and then the division shall be made equally.
14. Cash prizes shall be paid to winners only in classes included in the judge's list.
15. The judges shall report only the animals or articles entitled to premiums in the judge's list, though they may commend others they deem

worthy. The superintendent may deny entry to any animal or exhibit he deems unworthy of public display.

16. No animal or article deemed unworthy shall be awarded a premium. No premiums shall be withheld merely because there is no competition. Decision of the judge shall be final.
17. No person shall be allowed to see the judging books until after the awards have been made and entered.

## **PENALTIES AND PROTESTS**

18. The manager will appoint a superintendent and one or more judges for each division when deemed necessary. No person can act as a judge in any division or class in which there is any direct or indirect interest in the result as owner or agent; and when awards have been made in violation of this rule the manager reserves the right to appoint a new judge and to compel another examination.
19. Any person interfering with the judge during the adjudication of awards will forfeit the right of premiums. All officers or judges are required, and exhibitors are requested, to report any violation of this rule to the manager of the Puyallup Fair.
20. All protests must be made in writing, and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$25.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal, and must be filed with the manager within 24 hours after the cause of protest.
21. **NO PERSON SHALL BE ALLOWED TO SELL OR GIVE AWAY ARTICLES ON THE GROUNDS, EITHER DURING THE FAIR OR AT ANY TIME BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE SAME, UNTIL THE LICENSE FOR THE PRIVILEGE SHALL HAVE BEEN PAID AND RECEIPT THEREFORE ISSUED. THIS INCLUDES BALLOONS OR OTHER NOVELTIES FOR WHICH THE FAIR CONTRACTS THE SALE PRIVILEGE.**

## **ELECTRICAL USAGE NOTICE**

Electrical appliances which draw more than 200 watts and which are used for the personal convenience of exhibitors (kettles, coffee pots, space heaters, air conditioners, hot plates, etc.) are not allowed without permission. A costly power failure can result from overloading circuits.

# OPEN CLASS VETERINARIAN INFORMATION: WITHIN STATE OF WASHINGTON

The following are the minimum animal health requirements for the Puyallup Fair, including cattle, goats, sheep, llamas, horses, swine, pigeons, poultry, rabbits and cavy's originating within the state of Washington.

1. Individual Certificate of Veterinary Inspections on Washington animals is not required for entry into the Fair.
2. No animal from a quarantined area or premise may be permitted to enter the Fair or show.
3. OUT-OF-STATE ANIMAL ENTRIES MUST COMPLY WITH STATE OF WASHINGTON IMPORT REGULATIONS. NO EXEMPTIONS UNLESS EXEMPTED BY RULE.
4. Fair veterinarians will inspect all classes of livestock and poultry (including, but not limited to cattle, swine, horses, pet animals, rabbits, fur-bearing animals, pigeons, ducks, geese, turkeys, etc.) before they are exhibited to determine that the livestock and poultry show no clinical indications of contagious, infectious diseases and ectoparasites.
5. Fair veterinarians will reject any animal with infectious or contagious diseases or ectoparasites. Exhibitors should be made aware that ringworm, warts, pinkeye, strangles, contagious ecthyma, scabies, lice, mites, ticks and fleas fall into these categories.
6. Animals exhibiting disease symptoms during the course of the Fair will be removed from the exhibit areas, and either be sent home or kept in a quarantined area.
7. It is strongly recommended, but not required, that cattle be vaccinated in the current show year against respiratory diseases.
8. The Fair veterinarian's professional decision as to the health status of an animal will be final and will be upheld by the Fair Board.
9. Animals and birds not intended for exhibition will be denied entry to the grounds. Please leave your pet at home for its own protection, with the exception of guide/service dogs. They should be properly protected against infectious and communicable diseases as indicated for exhibit animals.
10. The Puyallup Fair requires all goats and sheep to be tagged or tattooed with Scrapie Identification.

Please remember that E.coli 0157:H7 infection can be transmitted by contact with animals. Youngsters, seniors and immune impaired persons are particularly susceptible. Hand washing facilities should be available wherever human-animal or animal waste contact is possible, and signage directing the public to those facilities is appropriate.

# OPEN CLASS VETERINARIAN INFORMATION: OUT OF STATE

Exhibitors of animals and birds originating outside of Washington must comply with state rules and regulations in addition to the requirements of the Puyallup Fair.

Entry permits are required for all out-of-state cattle. A blanket permit to each fair will be issued upon request by calling (360) 902-1878. The blanket permit number for the 2008 Puyallup Fair is 91-Z869

for out-of-state exhibitors. Their veterinarians need not call if they use this permit number on health certificates for this fair only.

Permits for special livestock sales may be obtained by calling the Livestock Identification Program at (360) 725-5505.

All out-of-state animals going to fairs must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection except for Idaho

and Oregon dogs, horses, sheep, goats, alpacas and llamas traveling to Washington with their owners in personal vehicles for roundtrip visits of not more than 96 hours. It requires that the Fair management provides veterinary inspection on arrival, and rejects any unhealthy animal. This exemption does not apply during emergency disease conditions declared by the State Veterinarian, or extend to any required testing.

### **OUT-OF-STATE CATTLE**

All cattle are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate), an import permit, which may be the blanket permit for the Fair, 91-Z869, and brucellosis vaccination for female cattle

Any dairy bulls over six months of age and any Dairy females over 20 months require a negative Brucellosis test within 30 days of shipment.

Any dairy bulls and heifers over six months of age require a negative Tuberculosis test within 60 days of shipment.

Any breed cattle over six months of age from the states of Michigan, Minnesota and New Mexico require a negative Tuberculosis test within 60 days of shipment

All cattle are required to have an ownership inspection (brand) prior to leaving the state of origin.

### **OUT-OF-STATE SHEEP AND GOATS**

All sheep and goats are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and all rams require an entry permit number. All sheep and goats must have official scrapie identification. Sheep and goats from Oregon and Idaho on a round trip of 96 hours or less are exempt from the requirement of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, provided the Fair management furnishes veterinary inspection on arrival and rejects any unhealthy animals. For stays longer than 96 hours, they must meet the Washington state import requirements.

If lactating goats are entering, their milk must be discarded during any stay in Washington, unless they have been tested for Brucellosis and Tuberculosis.

### **OUT-OF-STATE ALPACAS LLAMAS**

Llamas and alpacas are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. The exception includes those from Idaho and Oregon on a round trip of not more than 96 hours, provided the Fair management furnishes veterinary inspection on arrival and rejects any unhealthy animals.

### **OUT-OF-STATE POULTRY & PIGEONS**

All poultry entering Washington State for exhibition purposes must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate) within 30 days of shipment.

All poultry entering Washington state for exhibition purposes must originate from a NPIP participant flock or be tested negative for pullorum-thyphoid, Salmonella enteritidis and avian influenza within 30 days of shipment.

### **OUT-OF-STATE HORSES**

All horses are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, and horses over six months of age are required to have evidence of a negative test for (EIA) equine infectious anemia within six (6) months of entry.

Horses from Oregon and Idaho on a round trip of 96 hours or less are exempt from the requirement of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and EIA testing, provided the Fair management furnishes veterinary inspection on arrival and rejects any unhealthy animals

All horses are required to have an ownership inspection (brand) prior to leaving the state of origin.

### **OUT-OF-STATE SWINE**

All swine are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and an import permit number, which may be the blanket permit number issued to that fair.

All swine six months and over must be negative to a Brucellosis test within 30 days prior to entry into Washington, except swine originating from a validated Brucellosis-free herd or state.

# VEHICLE UNLOADING PROCEDURES

The Puyallup Fair is continually striving to make setup of merchandise and animal exhibits safer and more efficient. We are asking for your full cooperation in this safety program. **If you do not need to drive onto the grounds, please park in a Fair parking lot and hand truck or walk in.** When you have to drive in and unload, do so as quickly as possible and exit.

## Security Check

Each vehicle entering the grounds will be subject to search prior to entering the grounds. Please enter designated Security Checkpoint Staging Area located at the Service Gate area. Expect delays.

## Service Gate

Enter to receive vehicle permit to unload on grounds. You will be allowed one hour to unload and exit the grounds. Your pass will be date/time stamped. If you absolutely cannot complete your unloading in one hour, you must get the pass validated by a department superintendent or an administrative person.

## Traffic Pattern

Follow the traffic patterns as established. Surrender the vehicle permit at the time you exit the grounds.

## Fine

If you take longer than one hour and do not have validation for an extension, there is a parking fine of \$10.00 per hour.

## During Fair Time

Concessionaires and sponsors with vehicles will be allowed through the Service Gate between 6:00 am and 8:30 am with a Service Road Vehicle Permit. You will receive your gate permit from the attendant at the gate. **NO** vehicles are allowed through the gate after 8:30 am. All vehicles must be removed from the grounds by 9:00 am. Vehicles left unattended and without a permit for parking past the allotted time will either receive a warning and be asked to remove the vehicle from the grounds or be towed away at the owner's expense. Do not park in front of doorways or in vehicle traffic lanes. Your vehicle may be towed away. **HANG VEHICLE PERMIT ON THE REAR VIEW MIRROR SO YOU CAN BE FOUND IN AN EMERGENCY. Include the building where you can be located and your cell phone number.** Please unload quickly and remove your vehicle from the grounds. **NO KEYS ARE TO BE LEFT IN MOTORIZED VEHICLES ON DISPLAY.**

Open Class Poultry entry forms are due and must be postmarked by **August 25, 2008**, midnight. No late

entries will be accepted. Entry forms must include class number, sex/section, age, color letter, and leg band number. Out of state entries must be accompanied by an official blanket health certificate showing freedom from infectious or communicable disease within 90 days of entry. The state of Washington has all laws and regulations for participating as a pullorum-typhoid free state under the national poultry improvement plan. See veterinarian information in the front of this book.

The superintendent reserves the right to limit entries due to space limitations, handling entries on a first come, first serve basis.

Each exhibitor will receive three one-day passes when they bring their entries.

## IMPORTANT NEW INFORMATION FOR POULTRY EXHIBITORS

### NEW REGULATIONS (WAC 16-59) ADOPTED JANUARY 3, 2008

Birds entered at the Puyallup Fair will be subject to testing for Pullorum-Typhoid (P-T).

Birds which are entered from a National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) participating flock, and have documentation showing the NPIP number, will not have to be tested again. Birds that have been tested at other shows up to 90 days prior to the Puyallup Fair and have a certificate of proof will not have to be tested again.

If birds are tested at the Puyallup Fair they will be issued a certificate good for 90 days. All birds except waterfowl, pigeons and doves are required to be tested.

Birds will be tested with a small sterile needle (used only once). One small drop of blood from the wing vein is used. Results will be available within a few minutes.

There will be no testing before judging.

For owners who are interested, avian influenza testing will be offered again in 2008.

## OPEN CLASS POULTRY RULES

1. All birds will go through vet check. Any unsightly or diseased birds will be sent home and will not be allowed in the showroom.
2. **Entries postmarked later than August 25 will not be accepted.** Address all entries to Entry Office, The Puyallup Fair, 110 9th Avenue SW, Puyallup, WA 98371-6811. Please make sure to include Entry Office on the face of the envelope. Entry fee must accompany entry form.

3. The Poultry Building will be open to receive exhibits Wednesday, Sept. 3, from Noon to 8 pm.

ABSOLUTELY NO LATE ENTRIES, DUE TO LIMITED SPACE IN THE BARN.

4. All birds must enter and exit the barn through the south end (back) of the barn. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Section I exhibits must be removed Sunday evening, September 7 between 6 pm and 7 pm. Section II (geese and turkeys) may be brought in Sunday evening, September 7 **only after 9 pm** or Monday, September 8 from 7 am to 10 am. Please bring turkeys and geese in **solid bottom** carriers or portable containers that can be transported on the shuttle or push carts since no cars will be allowed in the pen area during Fair hours. Push carts, hand trucks, etc., will make poultry removal much easier early in the evening. Turkeys and geese will be released on Thursday, September 11 between 6 pm and 7 pm. Section III (guineas, peacocks and pheasants) may be brought in Thursday evening, September 11, **after 9pm** or Friday morning, September 12 between 7 am and 10 am. Please use portable containers to transport your entries onto the grounds. Check-out time for Section III will be between 6 pm and 7 pm on September 14.
5. All birds must be banded, and band numbers clearly marked on entry forms. If you are planning to buy bands for your birds after arrival at the Fair, leave that area on your entry form blank. Bands will be available for 50¢ per band at the Fair. Do not send band money with entry fee! After your birds are banded at the Fair, the band number information will be recorded on your entries.
6. **There will be no substitutions, except for band number.**
7. No exhibitor will be allowed to bring birds into the showroom unless entry fees have been paid in full. This rule is necessary so that exhibitors from a distance may have the same opportunity as the home breeder.
8. In filling out the entry forms, care should be taken to clearly state sex, age, variety, number of specimens, name of exhibitor and LEG BAND NUMBER TO BE USED AT TIME OF ENTRY.
9. For the purpose of this exhibition the terms "cock" and "hen" shall mean birds hatched before January 1, 2008. "Cockerel" and "Pullet" shall mean birds hatched after January 1, 2008.
10. Trios must be entered separately. **ONLY CHICKENS MAY BE ENTERED AS TRIOS.** There will be two kinds of trios; one for old chickens, and one for young chickens. A cock and two hens will constitute an old trio. A cockerel and two pullets will constitute a young trio. Old and young trios will not compete against each other.
11. All birds are in the charge of the superintendent of the poultry department during the Fair and cannot be removed without their consent. No one is allowed to handle birds other than their own.
12. No information regarding the number of entries in varieties will be given out in advance of the opening of the Fair.
13. No "FOR SALE" cards will be permitted on coops, in the barn, or on Fair property. No sale of birds will be allowed on Fair property.
14. The latest edition of "American Standard of Perfection" will be the guide for the judges in awarding the prizes for all varieties listed. Other varieties will be judged by the club standards.
15. Because of the season of the year when the show is held, it will be judged by comparison. The decision of the judges shall be final.
16. Exhibitors will not be allowed to put any premiums on their coops. This rule is necessary so that the public will not be misled by awards from other shows.
17. **DO NOT SEND IN OR PUT NAME CARDS ON DISPLAY COOPS. NOTHING IS TO BE PUT ON THE DISPLAY COOPS.**

18. The judge will not award a first prize on any specimen unless it is worthy.
19. The Puyallup Fair reserves the right to place two females in one coop in case entries are in excess of accommodations.
20. No special privileges, such as giving one bird or one pen larger coop space than other birds or pens of the same variety, will be granted. The Puyallup Fair reserves the right of prominently cooping or featuring any bird of special importance to the show.
21. All young birds exhibited must be 16 weeks of age or older, or will be banned from competition.
22. Birds shown as single specimens will not be eligible to form a part of a trio/pen.
23. Exhibitors should not be by or near the judge while they are judging.
24. **NOTE:** Electrical appliances which draw more than 200 watts, used for personal convenience of exhibitors (kettles, coffee pots, space heaters, air conditioners, hot plates, etc.) are not allowed without permission. A costly power failure can result from overloading circuits.
25. **Eating in the Barns vs. E. coli 0157:H7 – Exhibitor Cooperation Needed.**

Our barns will not only have signage reminding Fair guests to “Wash your hands upon leaving any livestock area”, but also “Please refrain from eating in livestock areas”.

The State Health Department has asked the Fair to request that our livestock exhibitors set an example for Fair guests and refrain from eating in most areas of the barns. In order to accommodate the Health Department’s request as well as address our exhibitor’s needs, we have set aside an area, screened from public view, in the south end of the dairy barn for exhibitors to eat.

Please check class numbers carefully. Standards (Large) and Bantams (Small) have different class numbers. If you aren’t sure, call the superintendent at (253) 845-7044 or the entry office at (253) 841-5017, and we will try to help you.
