DEPARTMENTAL EXHIBITORS RULES AND REGULATIONS

The general supervision of the entire Puyallup Fair and Spring Fair in Puyallup, including all exhibits, entertainment and concessions, has been vested by the Western Washington Fair Association board of directors in the Chief Executive Officer of the Association.

1. The Association will have officers on the grounds and will use every reasonable precaution in its power for the preservation and protection of persons, articles on exhibition, entries, livestock and property, but will not be responsible for loss or damage by theft, fire or otherwise.

TRADEMARKS AND COPYRIGHTS

2. Certain words, slogans and graphic symbols have been established to represent the Puyallup Fair and the Spring Fair in Puyallup, and are the exclusive property of the Western Washington Fair Association. "The Spring Fair in Puyallup" and "The Puyallup Fair" are trade names registered with Washington's Secretary of State. Artwork, slogans, music and other communications created to promote or represent the Association or its annual fairs are likewise protected by law. This includes the phrase "Do the Puyallup" and the music and lyrics of the song, "Do the Puyallup," the wordmark combining "THE SPRING FAIR IN PUYALLUP" and "THE PUYALLUP FAIR" and other temporary slogans such as "It's Spring, Baby!", "Epic Fun" or "I Love This Fair."

The valuable trade names and protected slogans and symbols may not be used without the express written consent of the Fair. In general, permission is granted under license, i.e., for consideration, or by permission under special circumstances. Submit requests to the marketing manager, along with complete information on frequency and distribution, including examples or written description of the proposed use.

WHEN ADDRESSING CORRESPONDENCE TO THE FAIR, PLEASE NOTE DEPARTMENT TO WHICH IT BELONGS ON THE FACE OF THE ENVELOPE.

3. Exhibitors should check each department for specific entry information. Read the special rules and other information printed in connection with the classification and prize list in each department. Note the time set for the closing of entries.
4. Every animal or article must be entered in the name of the owner, maker or grower.

ANYONE TRYING TO DECEIVE THE COMMITTEE WITH REGARD TO OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBIT, OR WHO SHALL PURCHASE OR BORROW THEM AND EXHIBIT THEM AS OF HIS OR HER OWN MANUFACTURE OR PRODUCTION, SHALL FORFEIT ALL CLAIMS AS AN EXHIBITOR.
5. No "FOR SALE" cards will be allowed on exhibits, in the buildings, or on the grounds.
6. Fair management reserves the right to cancel any class without prior notice for reasons deemed advisable by Fair legal counsel and/or Fair veterinarian.

ARRIVAL TIME OF EXHIBITS

7. The Puyallup Fair will be open for the receiving of articles according to the specified rules governing individual departments.
8. EXHIBITS MUST BE IN PLACE AT 8:00 A.M. THE FIRST DAY OF THE FAIR UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED. CHECK EACH DEPARTMENT'S ENTRY INFORMATION FOR POSSIBLE EXCEPTIONS.

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

9. First premiums shall be designated by blue ribbons, second premiums by red ribbons, third premiums by white ribbons, fourth premiums by pink ribbons, and fifth premiums by yellow ribbons.

10. No animal or article shall be allowed to compete for more than one open class premium, nor shall it be entered in more than one class, except as one of a herd, pair or pen, fur or wool, get of sire or dam, or in sweepstakes or championship classes. However, 4-H and FFA exhibitors may also show their registered livestock in open classes, provided their entries are received by the closing date for entries in the open class, and providing there is no conflict in judging schedule with the junior show.
 11. No animal or article shall be removed from the Fair before the close of the Fair or show, except by special permission from the superintendent. Any animal or article taken away before the close of the Fair or show without the permission of the superintendent shall forfeit all premiums. LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS: SEE RULES IN REGARD TO SPLIT SHOWS UNDER SPECIFIC DEPARTMENTS.
 12. Unless otherwise stated by a specific department, in cases where exhibits are tied for prizes, awards shall be determined as follows:
 - A. If the premium is a trophy, medal or any other award except a cash prize, the exhibitors entering these exhibits shall draw lots, the winner being awarded the premium.
 - B. If the premium is a cash prize, the money shall be divided equally among the exhibitors concerned. The next lower cash premium, if any, offered in the class shall be added to the premium for which the entries are tied, and then the division shall be made equally.
 13. Cash prizes shall be paid to winners only in classes included in the judge's list.
 14. The judges shall report only the animals or articles entitled to premiums in the judge's list, though they may commend others they deem worthy. The superintendent may deny entry to any animal or exhibit he deems unworthy of public display.
 15. No animal or article deemed unworthy shall be awarded a premium. No premiums shall be withheld merely because there is no competition. Decision of the judge shall be final.
 16. No person shall be allowed to see the judging books until after the awards have been made and entered.
- interest in the result as owner or agent; and when awards have been made in violation of this rule Fair management reserves the right to appoint a new judge and to compel another examination.
18. Any person interfering with the judge during the adjudication of awards will forfeit the right of premiums. All officers or judges are required, and exhibitors are requested, to report any violation of this rule to the department superintendent.
 19. All protests must be made in writing, and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$25.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal, and must be filed with the Puyallup Fair Entry Office within 24 hours after the cause of protest.
 20. NO PERSON SHALL BE ALLOWED TO SELL OR GIVE AWAY ARTICLES ON THE GROUNDS, EITHER DURING THE FAIR OR AT ANY TIME BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE SAME, UNTIL THE LICENSE FOR THE PRIVILEGE SHALL HAVE BEEN PAID AND RECEIPT THEREFORE ISSUED. THIS INCLUDES BALLOONS OR OTHER NOVELTIES FOR WHICH THE FAIR CONTRACTS THE SALE PRIVILEGE.

PERSONALITY RIGHTS

Exhibitor hereby grants to Western Washington Fair Association ("WWFA") the irrevocable, assignable, worldwide right and license to use, alter and publish his/her image, alone or together with other images and text, for WWFA publications and for all other purposes reasonably related to promotion of WWFA, the Spring Fair in Puyallup and Puyallup Fair, in any manner and in any medium now known or later developed, without the need for exhibitor's prior approval. This right and license will govern all images of exhibitor, whether created before or after the date of these Rules and Regulations, unless exhibitor notifies WWFA in writing that of a desire to exclude specific images from this right and license. Exhibitor hereby releases the photographer and/or videographer and WWFA, its agents and assigns, from all claims and liability relating to the licenses that exhibitor has granted in this license and release. This license and release will not obligate WWFA to use or publish exhibitor's image or use the rights exhibitor has granted.

ELECTRICAL USAGE NOTICE

Electrical appliances which draw more than 200 watts and which are used for the personal convenience of exhibitors (kettles, coffee pots, space heaters, air conditioners, hot plates, etc.) are not allowed without permission. A costly power failure can result from overloading circuits.

NO COOKING OR EATING IS ALLOWED IN THE BARN.

PENALTIES AND PROTESTS

17. Fair management will appoint a superintendent and one or more judges for each division when deemed necessary. No person can act as a judge in any division or class in which there is any direct or indirect

VEHICLE UNLOADING PROCEDURES

The Puyallup Fair is continually striving to make setup of merchandise and animal exhibits safer and more efficient. We are asking for your full cooperation in this safety program. **If you do not need to drive onto the grounds, please park in a Fair parking lot and hand truck or walk in.** When you have to drive in and unload, do so as quickly as possible and exit.

Security Check

Each vehicle entering the grounds will be subject to search prior to entering the grounds. Please enter designated Security Checkpoint Staging Area located at the Service Gate area. Expect delays.

Service Gate

Enter to receive vehicle permit to unload on grounds. You will be allowed one hour to unload and exit the grounds. Your pass will be date/time stamped. If you absolutely cannot complete your unloading in one hour, you must get the pass validated by a department superintendent or an administrative person.

Traffic Pattern

Follow the traffic patterns as established. Surrender the vehicle permit at the time you exit the grounds.

Fine

If you take longer than one hour and do not have validation for an extension, there is a parking fine of \$10.00 per hour.

During Fair Time

Concessionaires and sponsors with vehicles will be allowed through the Service Gate between 6:00 am and 8:30 am with a Service Road Vehicle Permit. You will receive your gate permit from the attendant at the gate. **NO** vehicles are allowed through the gate after 8:30 am. All vehicles must be removed from the grounds by 9:00 am. Vehicles left unattended and without a permit for parking past the allotted time will either receive a warning and be asked to remove the vehicle from the grounds or be towed away at the owner's expense. Do not park in front of doorways or in vehicle traffic lanes. Your vehicle may be towed away. **HANG VEHICLE PERMIT ON THE REAR VIEW MIRROR SO YOU CAN BE FOUND IN AN EMERGENCY. Include the building where you can be located and your cell phone number.** Please unload quickly and remove your vehicle from the grounds. **NO KEYS ARE TO BE LEFT IN MOTORIZED VEHICLES ON DISPLAY.**

VETERINARIAN RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

TOP FIVE DISEASE PREVENTION RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Segregation – Prevent contact of your livestock with other animals.
2. Restrict use of feed, equipment, and trailers to your animals.
3. Do not remove feed/bedding from the Fair. Equipment used at the Fair should be cleaned and disinfected.
4. Notify a veterinarian immediately if an animal becomes sick.
5. Isolate animals returning home for 30 days.

BIOSECURITY CHECKLIST FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

Before and During the Fair

- Monitor visitors to your animals and farm, especially if they have traveled outside the country.
- Make sure all veterinary health inspections and certificates of veterinary inspection are current for all animals you will take to the Fair.
- Follow the Fair vaccination guidelines and give recommended vaccination at least 10 days before the event.
- Disinfect all equipment, such as buckets, shovels, wheelbarrows, manure baskets, lead ropes, blankets snares, clippers, scissors, brushes, showbox and so forth before entering the fairgrounds.
- Don't share equipment with other exhibitors unless it has been cleaned and disinfected before and after use.
- Eliminate traffic between exhibitors of different species (especially sheep and cattle). If it is not possible to eliminate this traffic, change clothing and disinfect hands before handling a different species.
- As much as possible, minimize feed and water changes from home to Fair.

- Keep unused equipment and feed bagged or covered to reduce the risk of contamination.
- Vehicles and trailers used to transport animals to and from the Fair should be well cleaned and disinfected, inside and out, between uses.
- Do not mix species in the same trailer. Avoid commercial haulers with multiple animals from multiple farms.
- Clean and disinfect all items at the end of the Fair before taking them home.
- Properly dispose of unused bedding, hay and feed after the Fair. Do not bring it home.
- Minimize stress by keeping animals cool, well bedded and comfortable.

After the Fair

- Keep Fair animals isolated from other animals and pets for at least 30 days.
- Check these isolated animals every day for any signs of illness. Contact a vet if you see any unusual symptoms.
- Care for isolated animals separately, then shower, change your clothes and clean and disinfect your boots before going to other areas of the farm.
- The person caring for animals at the Fair should not perform animal-related chores at home. If the same person must do both, chores at home should be done first. Garments should be cleaned and disinfected between each trip to the Fair and barn/pasture.

OPEN CLASS VETERINARIAN INFORMATION: Livestock from WITHIN Washington State

The 2009 Exhibition Livestock Health requirements include many changes. Please read carefully.

The following are the minimum animal health requirements for the Puyallup Fair, including cattle, goats, sheep, llamas, horses, swine, pigeons, poultry, rabbits and cavies originating within the state of Washington. The Fair will have official veterinarians available for animal health care.

1. Individual Certificate of Veterinary Inspections on Washington animals is not required for entry into the Fair.
2. No animal from a quarantined area or premise may be permitted to enter the Fair or show.
3. OUT-OF-STATE ANIMAL ENTRIES MUST COMPLY WITH STATE OF WASHINGTON IMPORT REGULATIONS. NO EXEMPTIONS UNLESS EXEMPTED BY RULE.
4. Fair veterinarians will inspect all classes of livestock and poultry (including, but not limited to cattle, swine, horses, pet animals, rabbits, fur-bearing animals, pigeons, ducks, geese, turkeys, etc.) before they are permitted access into the barns to determine that the livestock and poultry show no clinical indications of contagious, infectious diseases and ectoparasites.
5. Fair veterinarians will reject any animal with infectious or contagious diseases or ectoparasites. Exhibitors should be made aware that ringworm, warts, pinkeye, strangles, contagious ecthyma, scabies, lice, mites, ticks and fleas fall into these categories.
6. Animals exhibiting disease symptoms during the course of the Fair will be removed from the exhibit areas, and either be sent home or kept in a quarantined area.
7. It is strongly recommended, but not required, that cattle be vaccinated in the current show year against respiratory diseases. Any cattle going to the Fair should have adequate protection against IBR, BVD, PI3, and BRSV.
8. The Fair veterinarian's professional decision as to the health status of an animal will be final and will be upheld by the Fair board.
9. Animals and birds not intended for exhibition will be denied entry to the grounds. Please leave your pet at home for its own protection, with the exception of guide/service animals. They should be properly protected against infectious and communicable diseases as indicated for exhibit animals.
10. The Puyallup Fair requires all goats and sheep to be tagged or tattooed with Scrapie Identification.
11. All sheep will be inspected with blankets removed before allowed entrance to the barns.

Killed products need appropriate booster to have maximum benefit depending on what vaccines have been given in the past. In addition, they should have five-way lepto and eight-way clostridial protection. It also doesn't pay to buy the cheapest product available. There is a difference in vaccines. The intranasal product is suggested, whether or not it will protect for MCF, it will give IBR protection.

Please remember that E.coli 0157:H7 infection can be transmitted by contact with animals. Youngsters, seniors and immune impaired persons are particularly susceptible. Hand washing facilities are available and should be used wherever human-animal or animal waste contact is possible, and signage directing the public to those facilities is visible throughout the barns.

OPEN CLASS VETERINARIAN INFORMATION: Livestock from OUTSIDE Washington State

Exhibitors of animals and birds originating outside of Washington must comply with state rules and regulations in addition to the requirements of the Puyallup Fair.

Entry permits are required for all out-of-state cattle. A blanket permit to each Fair will be issued upon request by calling (360) 902-1878. The blanket permit number for the 2009 Puyallup Fair is 91-C1432 for out-of-state exhibitors. Their veterinarians need not call if they use this permit number on health certificates for this Fair only.

Permits for special livestock sales may be obtained by calling the Livestock Identification Program at (360) 725-5505.

All out-of-state animals going to Fairs must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection except for Idaho and Oregon dogs, horses, sheep, goats, alpacas and llamas traveling to Washington with their owners in personal vehicles for roundtrip visits of not more than 96 hours. It requires that the Fair management provides veterinary inspection on arrival, and rejects any unhealthy animal. This exemption does not apply during emergency disease conditions declared by the State Veterinarian, or extend to any required testing.

OUT-OF-STATE CATTLE

All cattle are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate) listing official individual identification and an import permit, which may be the blanket permit for the Fair, 91-C1432.

All dairy bulls over six months of age and any dairy females over 20 months require a negative Brucellosis test within 30 days of shipment if being sold. No test is required if for show only.

All dairy bulls and heifers over six months of age require a negative Tuberculosis test within 60 days of shipment.

Any breed cattle over six months of age from the states of California, Michigan, Minnesota and New Mexico and the countries of Canada and Mexico require a negative Tuberculosis test within 60 days of shipment.

All cattle are required to have an ownership inspection (brand) from the state of origin prior to entering the Fair.

Canadian Cattle: These cattle must comply with Washington state import requirements. Non-vaccinated Canadian cattle will be allowed entry into the Fair and return to Canada. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, an entry permit number (blanket permit for the 2009 Fair is 91-C1432), a negative Tuberculosis test within 60 days of shipment and a negative Brucellosis test within 30 days are required. If the cattle remain in the state, they must meet Washington Brucellosis requirements.

OUT-OF-STATE SHEEP AND GOATS

All sheep and goats are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and all rams require an entry permit number. All sheep and goats must have official scrapie identification. Sheep and goats from Oregon and Idaho on a round trip of 96 hours or less are exempt from the requirement of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, provided the Fair management furnishes veterinary inspection on arrival and rejects any unhealthy animals. For stays longer than 96 hours, they must meet the Washington state import requirements.

If lactating goats are entering, their milk must be discarded during any stay in Washington, unless they have been tested for Brucellosis and Tuberculosis.

OUT-OF-STATE ALPACAS LLAMAS

Llamas and alpacas are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. The exception includes those from Idaho and Oregon on a round trip of not more than 96 hours, provided the Fair management furnishes veterinary inspection on arrival and rejects any unhealthy animals.

OUT-OF-STATE POULTRY AND PIGEONS

All poultry entering Washington state for exhibition purposes must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate) within 30 days of shipment.

All poultry entering Washington state for exhibition purposes must originate from a NPIP participant flock or be tested negative for pullorum-thyphoid, Salmonella enteritidis and avian influenza within 30 days of shipment.

OUT-OF-STATE HORSES

All horses are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, and horses over six months of age are required to have evidence of a negative test for (EIA) equine infectious anemia within six (6) months of entry.

Horses from Oregon and Idaho on a round trip of 96 hours or less are exempt from the requirement of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and EIA testing, provided the Fair management furnishes veterinary inspection on arrival and rejects any unhealthy animals

All horses are required to have an ownership inspection (brand) prior to leaving the state of origin.

OUT-OF-STATE SWINE

All swine are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and an import permit number, which may be the blanket permit number issued to that Fair.

All swine six months and over coming from the state of Texas must be negative to a Brucellosis test within 30 days prior to entry into Washington, except swine originating from a validated Brucellosis-free herd.

ATTENTION!! ALL BEEF EXHIBITORS

The following items are important rules and information you need to be aware of for the 2009 Fair.

1. All feed and grain must be kept in the stall area. The hay and straw storage shed will not be open to exhibitors. Please order hay and straw in writing from your superintendent before 6 pm for the following morning's requirements. Hay and straw bales should not be used for purposes other than feed and bedding.
 2. All extension cords used in the barn must be 14 gauge or heavier.
 3. No calves shall be entered with birth dates later than April 30, 2009 unless breed so states.
 4. Any cow nursing a calf which is not her own is considered a "nurse" cow. See Beef Cattle General Rules.
 5. A Social Security Number will no longer be required on the entry form. If an exhibitor is likely to earn over \$600 in premiums, a W-9 form must be filled out by that exhibitor and turned into the beef office before the end of their show. A W-9 will be mailed to those exhibitors who earn over \$600 and don't have a W-9 on file in the entry office. Premiums will be withheld until a completed W-9 form is received in the Entry Office (this is a requirement from the IRS.) Canadian exhibitors are required to complete form 8233 before premiums can be paid.
 6. If you wish to compete in any group classes, you must enter those classes on the entry form. It is not necessary to include which animals are to be entered in the group class. No entry fee for group classes.
 7. Each exhibitor is limited to two premiums per class.
 8. Junior exhibitors must be the sole registered owner of their animals to qualify for premiums in the junior show, unless otherwise specified by specific breed association rules, with the exception of Pee Wee Showmanship.
 9. JUNIOR ANGUS EXHIBITORS must include their American Angus Association Member Code and birth date in order to receive additional premiums offered for breed classes by the American Angus Association.
 10. If you are unable to show after you have entered your animal, please notify the Entry Office, (253) 841-5074 immediately.
 11. Animals must be shown by single individual in all classes except group classes.
 12. All junior shows must have at least 10 exhibitors to qualify for premium money. The Fair will limit matching premiums to \$750 for each junior show.
 13. THERE WILL BE NO NIGHT TIE-OUTS.
 14. Shavings will be used for all bedding in the Beef Barn.
 15. Cattle must be out of the barn by 8:30 pm on release nights.
 16. No butt fans will be allowed.
 17. No smoking or alcoholic beverages are allowed in the barns.
 18. Animals may no longer be walked on or off the grounds because of serious environmental concerns directly related to animal waste. Any animal (except horses) that cannot be transported in a solid bottom carrier must be removed in a truck, trailer or similar conveyance.
 19. Electrical appliances which draw more than 200 watts and which are used for the personal convenience of exhibitors (kettles, coffee pots, space heaters, air conditioners, hot plates, etc.) are not allowed without permission. Please check with your superintendent. A costly power failure can result from overloading circuits.
 20. All out-of-state cattle will need a brand slip issued by a brand inspector.
 21. All in-state cattle will need to have a haul slip filled out.
 22. No cooking is allowed in the barns.
- 23. EATING IN THE BARN VS. E. COLI O157:H7 – EXHIBITOR COOPERATION NEEDED.**
This year our barns will not only have signage reminding Fair guests to "Wash your hands upon leaving any livestock area", but also "Please refrain from eating in livestock areas".
- The State Health Department has asked the Fair to request that our livestock exhibitors set an example for Fair guests and refrain from eating in most areas of the barns. In order to accommodate the Health Department's request, as well as address our exhibitors' needs, we have set aside an area, screened from public view, in the south end of the dairy barn for exhibitors to eat.

There is no entry fee for group classes.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Showing less than 30 head of any breed in a given year may be grounds for elimination from the show schedule the following year.

All beef animals, including animals in the junior show must be entered in and pay entry fee for the open show. Junior show animals must also enter junior show classes, but need not pay an additional entry fee to the Fair. A fee may be charged by the junior associations. Do not send association fees to the Fair office. Animals must be entered in junior's name.

Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by entry fees.

Entry fees will not be refunded unless cancellation is received by Monday, August 24, 2009, or if superintendent is presented with a veterinary certificate stating health reason for cancellation.

Substitutions within same breed must be cleared through the Fair department superintendent. Substitutions must be received Monday, August 24, 2009 in order to appear in the show program.

Grand champion heifer and bull in each breed will receive a prize of \$25.

ALL CATTLE MUST BE VET CHECKED BEFORE ENTERING BARN. REGISTRATION PAPERS MUST BE CHECKED IN AT BEEF OFFICE.

BEEF CATTLE RULES

1. **EATING IN THE BARN VS. E. COLI O157:H7 EXHIBITOR COOPERATION NEEDED**

Our barns have signage reminding Fair guests to "Wash your hands upon leaving any livestock area", as well as "Please refrain from eating in livestock areas."

The State Health Department has asked the Fair to request that our livestock exhibitors set an example for Fair guests and refrain from eating in most areas of the barns. In order to accommodate the Health Department's request, as well as address our exhibitors' needs, we have set aside an area, screened from public view, in the south end of the dairy barn where exhibitors may eat.

2. Exhibitors are requested to have stalls and cattle ready by 8 am for opening of the Fair each day. Only two head from a string may be tied to the wash rack at one time.
3. Any cow nursing a calf which is not her own is considered a nurse cow, and not permitted. Only cow-calf pairs are allowed for special shows. The calf must be eligible for entry in the individual class.
4. The hay storage shed will not be open to exhibitors. Please order hay in writing from your superintendent before 6 pm for the following morning's requirements. Hay bales should not be used for purposes other than feed. All hay and bedding for cattle exhibited in the cattle department will be furnished by the Fair, free of charge.
5. No 4-H dorm space will be available to open class exhibitors.
6. No dogs are permitted in the Beef Barn.
7. Animals must be shown by a single individual in all classes, except group classes.
8. All cattle must be double tied while in stalls (halter plus neck rope).
9. All animals entered for exhibition shall be registered in a recognized breed association, and the exhibitor shall present registration certificates to the Beef superintendent at the time the cattle are admitted.

All entrants must have current and valid registration in the breed association sponsoring the show in which they are to participate.

10. The Fair officials shall check all certificates for ownership, age, correct entry in class, and identification of the animal when cattle arrive at the Fair. Animals with incorrect or illegible tattoos will be barred from showing. Tattooing will not be allowed on Fair property. All exhibits must be exhibited under ownership of the person(s), partnership or company whose name appears on the registration papers. Signed transfer applications will not be accepted as evidence of ownership.
11. Any animal to be shown in any of the group classes must first be shown in its proper individual class.
12. An exhibitor is defined as: Any person or partnership in whose name cattle are registered. This shall include individual members of a family.
13. Each exhibitor is limited to two (2) premiums per class, except where noted.
14. In the group classes, an exhibitor is defined as: All members of a family or partnership where the cattle are housed on the same farm.
15. Tampering and Misrepresentation: Any artificial means of removing or remedying the physical defects or conformation in the exhibition of cattle, such as cutting ties or lifting and filling under the skin will be considered as fraud and deception. All animals showing evidence of such treatment will be barred from competition at the Puyallup Fair. Misrepresentation of the age of an animal will be considered in the same light.
16. All animals entering the judging ring must have their entry numbers prominently displayed on the person showing the animal.
17. Bulls over one year old must be shown with a nose lead.
18. Each exhibitor will be sent two (2) one-day gate admission passes with their replay letter. In addition, one pass per day per each five head entered can be picked up from the superintendent after arrival at the Fair for use by the exhibitor or their herdsman.

19. The competition for reserve championship in both sexes shall include the animal winning second place in individual class which furnishes the grand champion, in addition to the first place winners in all other classes.
20. In computing the award for Premier Breeder, credit will be given in all regular single classes. This award will be given to the breeder winning the most points on his best six head; including animals bred by him and exhibited by others. In case of a tie, the exhibitor with the most champions will be the winner.
21. The award for Premier Exhibitor will be computed in the same manner as Premier Breeder on the top six animals owned by exhibitor. The calculations will be made on listed premiums. In case of a tie, the exhibitor with the most champions will be the winner.
22. See Cattle Health Requirements in front of this book for exhibitors from Washington state.
23. Out-of-state exhibitors should read the Cattle Health Requirements, as there is a section applying specifically to out-of-state exhibitors.
24. If you can't handle your cattle, please leave them home.

NOTE TO CANADIAN EXHIBITORS
(This information will apply when the border restrictions are lifted)

For show purposes, Canadian cattle, beef or dairy must comply with Washington's import requirements. Non-vaccinated Canadian cattle may enter the Fair. The Brucellosis and Tuberculosis tests are no longer required on Canadian cattle. Exhibitors should check with Agriculture Canada to determine most current requirements affecting their return to Canada from the Fair. A valid health certificate and entry permit must accompany shipments of all classes of cattle into the state of Washington. Entry permit 91-C1432 may be used on all Canadian shipments coming to the Fair. This number is to appear on the health certificate accompanying the cattle. There is a 30-day limit on Canadian cattle using this entry permit.

SUGGESTIONS FOR EXHIBITORS

Every animal exhibited must constantly be kept in the best possible condition. Stalls must be kept clean. The Fair will furnish sufficient help to remove manure from the barns to prevent an accumulation.

Attractive and informative signs concerning ownership and breeding are encouraged. The superintendent of the Beef Barn should be consulted to determine the most desirable location for them. No "FOR SALE" sign, or signs advertising any brand of feed or other commodity will be permitted in the cattle barns.

Every exhibitor should be interested in keeping the Cattle Department as attractive as possible. This cannot be done if each exhibitor undertakes to show his cattle in his own way, and not in harmony with the entire exhibit. All exhibitors are requested to have stalls and cattle ready by 8 am for the opening of the Fair each day.

An exhibitor is unfair to himself, or the owner of the cattle they are exhibiting, if they do not present the animals in the best of condition at all times. This cannot be done if a barrel of water, a few bales of hay or straw, and a lot of cast-off clothing and unattractive bedding are permitted to interfere with the general appearance of the exhibit.

Recently, blocking or grooming chutes have come into general usage. As alleyways must be kept clear for Fair visitors, a grooming chute must be placed in the clip chute area. No special fee will be collected. However the superintendent requests that, if an exhibitor is going to use a grooming chute, he indicate his intention at the time he sends his entries so space can be allowed. We cannot allow obstructed alleyways, and it should be the duty of every exhibitor to present their exhibit in the best manner possible. The mess that is evident with the use of grooming chutes must be kept to a minimum.

TRAVEL BONUS

To encourage exhibitors through the western United States and Canada to exhibit cattle at the Puyallup Fair, the Fair will offer a travel bonus to any exhibitor or exhibitor unit that meets the following criteria:

1. The maximum number of head for which any exhibitor will be paid a travel bonus is ten (10) head per exhibitor. There will be no minimum number required.
2. Any exhibitor inside or outside of the state of Washington shall qualify for the travel bonus.
3. The exhibitor must apply for the travel bonus at the Beef Show office at check-in time. Fill out a form that includes name of exhibitor, farm name, address, number of head (up to 10 only),

and the entry numbers of the head you are claiming. If you have made arrangements with another exhibitor to haul their animals in exchange for their travel bonus, you must list their name and the entry numbers of their animals on the form, along with your own (the total claimed may still only be 10 head).

If you wish to apply for the travel bonus, when you check in, request a travel bonus form. Fill it out indicating the number of miles you traveled to the Fair (please be accurate), the number of your own head you are exhibiting, and the entry numbers of your animals. It is your responsibility to make sure this information is accurate and turned in to the office.

ANGUS SHOW RULES

The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Missouri, will participate in premiums offered for open class Angus breeding cattle classes according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense, and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of 50 head must be shown in the open class division to receive American Angus Association premium participation for the following year.

Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle, and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. All cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay on championship or any group classes, (i.e. get-of sire, junior get-of-sire or breeder six-head).

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. ELECTRONICALLY STORED REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES ARE NOT ACCEPTED – ONLY THE ORIGINAL CERTIFICATES ISSUED BY THE AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with a calf at side, the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check-in.

Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association rules, as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2, Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 series; including Rules 800-811. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp, or other similar substances externally, and steroids, growth stimulants, or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors, or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white gloves" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules, and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

Open Show American Angus Association Show Classification for Angus

Any classes listed in this classification which exceed 15 head per class should be broken into smaller

classes. This should be accomplished by dividing the class as evenly as possible without splitting animals with the same birth date.

Example 1: If 16 head are entered in Class 4, the class should be broken into two classes of 8, a class 7 and 9, or a class of 10 and 6.

Example 2: If 32 head are entered in Class 4, the class should be divided into three classes consisting of two classes with 11 head, and one class of 10 head, or similar, without putting animals with the same birth date in different classes.

Class breaks will be at the discretion of the American Angus Association staff in attendance.

This Classification is effective for shows July 15, 2009 to December 31, 2009.

Only registered Angus cattle that meet the age requirements listed within this classification are eligible to receive premium participation and be counted in the total number of head shown – champion and reserve champion placings are not counted in number of head shown.

JUNIOR ANGUS SHOW RULES

The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Missouri, will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for Junior Angus Heifers as included in its standard show classifications according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the Junior Angus Heifer classes to receive American Angus Association premium participation. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums.

Separate classes for bred and owned heifers may be held if the size of the show merits a separate class.

To be eligible for Association premiums heifer entries must be recorded in the sole name of the Junior Exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership. The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class.

Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in Championship Classes. An animal may only be counted one time toward the total count for premium participation by the Association.

Exhibitors must have the ORIGINAL REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE on each animal available for inspection

at the show. ELECTRONICALLY STORED REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES ARE NOT ACCEPTED – ONLY THE ORIGINAL CERTIFICATES ISSUED BY THE AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with a calf at side, the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check-in.

Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in part 2; Association rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are part 2: association rules; rule 800 series; including rule 800-811. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp or any other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white

towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

All entries must be postmarked by August 1, 2009.

The Puyallup Fair will pay premiums to match those being offered to the Junior Angus Exhibitors by the Western Washington Angus Association, not to exceed \$750. Juniors must have 10 exhibitors to receive money from the Fair.

**American Angus Association
Standard Classification for Junior Heifer Shows**

Any class listed in this classification, which exceeds 15 head per class, should be broken into smaller

classes. This should be accomplished by dividing the class as evenly as possible without splitting animals with the same birth date.

Example 1: If 16 head are entered in class 4, the class should be broken into two classes of 8, a class of 7 and 9, or a class of 10 and 6.

All beef cattle will be checked in at the west entrance of the Beef Barn. **IMPORTANT** – please fill out entry form correctly and completely. Be sure to include the section titled “Breed of Animal”. All eligible animals must have been vaccinated against Brucellosis. It is strongly recommended that cattle be vaccinated in the current show year against respiratory diseases. **NO NURSE COWS ALLOWED. ALL ANIMALS MUST BE ENTERED FOR SHOW.** All livestock must be checked by the contracted veterinarian prior to admittance. Exhibitor must present registration papers to the superintendent, upon request. All animals must remain on site for the duration of the Fair.
5. All breeds must follow show rules as outlined in class listings. All bulls over 12 months of age must have a bull lead whenever they are not

double tied in the stall. They must be shown with a bull lead. No tie-outs are allowed in show ring. The American System is used for judging and placing. Tampering and misrepresentation: Any artificial means of removing or altering the physical characteristics or conformation in the exhibition of cattle, such as cutting ties or lifting and filling under the skin will be considered as fraud and deception. All animals showing evidence of such treatment will be barred from competition. Misrepresentation of the age of an animal will be considered in the same light. The Fair and/or superintendent reserve the right to add, split or combine lots as deemed necessary in the best interest of the show. Exhibitors agree to abide by the IAFE (International Fair and Expositions) National Code of Ethics. The Fair reserves the right to substitute the judge, as necessary.

6. ANIMALS MUST BE IN THEIR PLACE BY TIMES STATED IN THE SCHEDULE. Double tie required on all animals. Animal exhibits are not allowed

out of the general vicinity of the barns and the show rings. Exceptions are made with the superintendent's approval only. Best exhibit competition is mandatory. 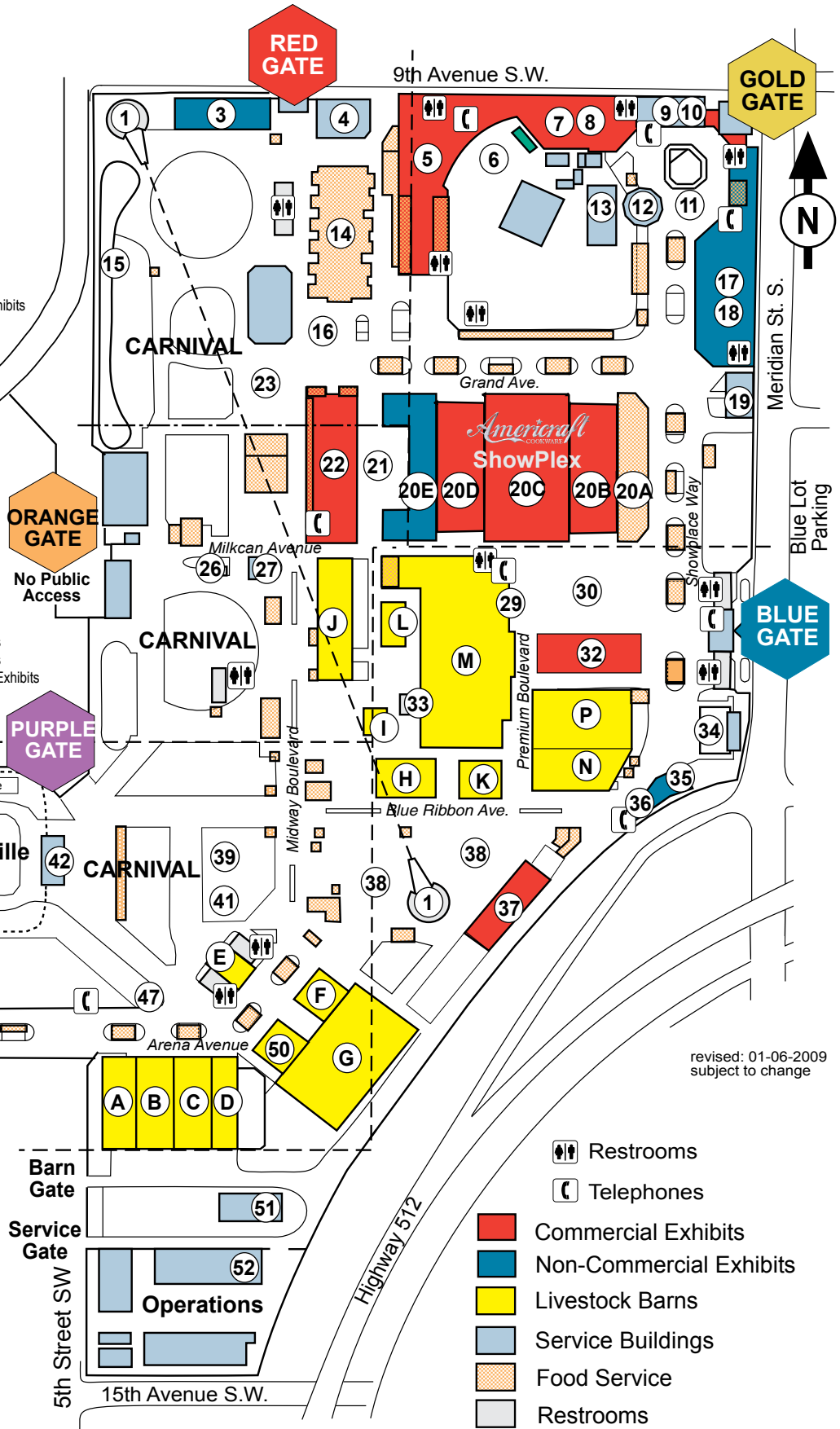
