DEPARTMENTAL EXHIBITORS RULES AND REGULATIONS

The general supervision of the entire Puyallup Fair, including all exhibits, entertainment and concessions, has been vested in the manager of the Association by the Western Washington Fair board of directors.

1. The Association will have officers on the grounds and will use every reasonable precaution in its power for the preservation and protection of persons, articles on exhibition, livestock and property; but will not be responsible for loss or damage by theft, fire or otherwise.

TRADEMARKS AND COPYRIGHTS

2. Certain words, slogans and graphic symbols have been established to represent the Puyallup Fair, and are the exclusive property of the Western Washington Fair Association. "The Puyallup Fair" is a trade name registered with Washington's Secretary of State. Artwork, slogans, music and other communications created to promote or represent the Association or its annual fairs are likewise protected by law. This includes the phrase "Do the Puyallup" and the music and lyrics of the song, "Do the Puyallup," the wordmark combining "THE PUYALLUP FAIR" with or without cow heads and other temporary slogans such as "Epic Fun," "I Love This Fair" or "Come Together".

The valuable trade names and protected slogans and symbols may not be used without the express written consent of the Fair. In general, permission is granted under license, i.e., for consideration, or by permission under special circumstances. Submit requests to the marketing manager, along with complete information on frequency and distribution, including examples or written description of the proposed use.

3. EXHIBITS MUST BE IN PLACE AT 8:00 A.M. THE FIRST DAY OF THE FAIR. CHECK EACH DEPARTMENT FOR POSSIBLE EXCEPTIONS.
4. The Western Washington Fair Association assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to entries. Every reasonable precaution will be used to protect items on display.

WHEN ADDRESSING CORRESPONDENCE TO THE FAIR, PLEASE NOTE DEPARTMENT TO WHICH IT BELONGS ON THE FACE OF THE ENVELOPE.

Read the special rules and other information printed in connection with the classification and prize list in each department. Note the time set for the closing of entries.

6. Every animal or article must be entered in the name of the owner, maker or grower.

ANYONE TRYING TO DECEIVE THE COMMITTEE WITH REGARD TO OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBIT, OR WHO SHALL PURCHASE OR BORROW THEM AND EXHIBIT THEM AS OF HIS OR HER OWN MANUFACTURE OR PRODUCTION, SHALL FORFEIT ALL CLAIMS AS AN EXHIBITOR.

7. No "FOR SALE" cards will be allowed on exhibits, in the buildings, or on the grounds.
8. Fair management reserves the right to cancel any class without prior notice for reasons deemed advisable by Fair legal counsel and/or Fair veterinarian.

ARRIVAL TIME OF EXHIBITS

9. The Puyallup Fair will be open for the receiving of articles according to the specified rules governing individual departments.

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

10. First premiums shall be designated by blue ribbons, second premiums by red ribbons, third premiums by white ribbons, fourth premiums by pink ribbons, and fifth premiums by yellow ribbons.
11. No animal or article shall be allowed to compete for more than one open class premium, nor shall it be entered in more than one class, except as one of a herd, pair or pen, fur or wool, get of sire or dam, or in sweepstakes or championship classes. However, 4-H and FFA exhibitors may also show their registered livestock in open classes provided their entries are received by the closing date for entries in the open class, and providing there is no conflict in judging schedule with the junior show.
12. No animal or article shall be removed from the Fair before the close of the Fair except by special permission from the manager. Any animal or article taken away before the close of the Fair, without the permission of the manager, shall forfeit all premiums. **LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS: SEE RULES IN REGARD TO SPLIT SHOWS UNDER SPECIFIC DEPARTMENTS.**
13. Unless otherwise stated by a specific department, in cases where exhibits are tied for prizes, awards shall be determined as follows:
 - A. If the premium is a trophy, medal or any other award except a cash prize, the exhibitors entering these exhibits shall draw lots, the winner being awarded the premium.
 - B. If the premium is a cash prize, the money shall be divided equally among the exhibitors concerned. The next lower cash premium, if any, offered in the class shall be added to the premium for which the entries are tied and then the division shall be made equally.
14. Cash prizes shall be paid to winners only in classes included in the judge's list.
15. The judges shall report only the animals or articles entitled to premiums in the judge's list, though they may commend others they deem

worthy. The superintendent may deny entry to any animal or exhibit he deems unworthy of public display.

16. No animal or article deemed unworthy shall be awarded a premium. No premiums shall be withheld merely because there is no competition. Decision of the judge shall be final.
17. No person shall be allowed to see the judging books until after the awards have been made and entered.

PENALTIES AND PROTESTS

18. The manager will appoint a superintendent and one or more judges for each division when deemed necessary. No person can act as a judge in any division or class in which there is any direct or indirect interest in the result as owner or agent; and when awards have been made in violation of this rule the manager reserves the right to appoint a new judge and to compel another examination.
19. Any person interfering with the judge during the adjudication of awards will forfeit the right of premiums. All officers or judges are required, and exhibitors are requested, to report any violation of this rule to the manager of the Puyallup Fair.
20. All protests must be made in writing, and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$25.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal, and must be filed with the manager within 24 hours after the cause of protest.
21. **NO PERSON SHALL BE ALLOWED TO SELL OR GIVE AWAY ARTICLES ON THE GROUNDS, EITHER DURING THE FAIR OR AT ANY TIME BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE SAME, UNTIL THE LICENSE FOR THE PRIVILEGE SHALL HAVE BEEN PAID AND RECEIPT THEREFORE ISSUED. THIS INCLUDES BALLOONS OR OTHER NOVELTIES FOR WHICH THE FAIR CONTRACTS THE SALE PRIVILEGE.**

ELECTRICAL USAGE NOTICE

Electrical appliances which draw more than 200 watts and which are used for the personal convenience of exhibitors (kettles, coffee pots, space heaters, air conditioners, hot plates, etc.) are not allowed without permission. A costly power failure can result from overloading circuits.

OPEN CLASS VETERINARIAN INFORMATION: WITHIN STATE OF WASHINGTON

The following are the minimum animal health requirements for the Puyallup Fair, including cattle, goats, sheep, llamas, horses, swine, pigeons, poultry, rabbits and cavies originating within the state of Washington.

1. Individual Certificate of Veterinary Inspections on Washington animals is not required for entry into the Fair.
2. No animal from a quarantined area or premise may be permitted to enter the Fair or show.
3. OUT-OF-STATE ANIMAL ENTRIES MUST COMPLY WITH STATE OF WASHINGTON IMPORT REGULATIONS. NO EXEMPTIONS UNLESS EXEMPTED BY RULE.
4. Fair veterinarians will inspect all classes of livestock and poultry (including, but not limited to cattle, swine, horses, pet animals, rabbits, fur-bearing animals, pigeons, ducks, geese, turkeys, etc.) before they are exhibited to determine that the livestock and poultry show no clinical indications of contagious, infectious diseases and ectoparasites.
5. Fair veterinarians will reject any animal with infectious or contagious diseases or ectoparasites. Exhibitors should be made aware that ringworm, warts, pinkeye, strangles, contagious ecthyma, scabies, lice, mites, ticks and fleas fall into these categories.
6. Animals exhibiting disease symptoms during the course of the Fair will be removed from the exhibit areas, and either be sent home or kept in a quarantined area.
7. It is strongly recommended, but not required, that cattle be vaccinated in the current show year against respiratory diseases.
8. The Fair veterinarian's professional decision as to the health status of an animal will be final and will be upheld by the Fair Board.
9. Animals and birds not intended for exhibition will be denied entry to the grounds. Please leave your pet at home for its own protection, with the exception of guide/service dogs. They should be properly protected against infectious and communicable diseases as indicated for exhibit animals.
10. The Puyallup Fair requires all goats and sheep to be tagged or tattooed with Scrapie Identification.

Please remember that E.coli 0157:H7 infection can be transmitted by contact with animals. Youngsters, seniors and immune impaired persons are particularly susceptible. Hand washing facilities should be available wherever human-animal or animal waste contact is possible, and signage directing the public to those facilities is appropriate.

OPEN CLASS VETERINARIAN INFORMATION: OUT OF STATE

Exhibitors of animals and birds originating outside of Washington must comply with state rules and regulations in addition to the requirements of the Puyallup Fair.

Entry permits are required for all out-of-state cattle. A blanket permit to each fair will be issued upon request by calling (360) 902-1878. The blanket permit number for the 2008 Puyallup Fair is 91-Z869

for out-of-state exhibitors. Their veterinarians need not call if they use this permit number on health certificates for this fair only.

Permits for special livestock sales may be obtained by calling the Livestock Identification Program at (360) 725-5505.

All out-of-state animals going to fairs must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection except for Idaho

and Oregon dogs, horses, sheep, goats, alpacas and llamas traveling to Washington with their owners in personal vehicles for roundtrip visits of not more than 96 hours. It requires that the Fair management provides veterinary inspection on arrival, and rejects any unhealthy animal. This exemption does not apply during emergency disease conditions declared by the State Veterinarian, or extend to any required testing.

OUT-OF-STATE CATTLE

All cattle are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate), an import permit, which may be the blanket permit for the Fair, 91-Z869, and brucellosis vaccination for female cattle

Any dairy bulls over six months of age and any Dairy females over 20 months require a negative Brucellosis test within 30 days of shipment.

Any dairy bulls and heifers over six months of age require a negative Tuberculosis test within 60 days of shipment.

Any breed cattle over six months of age from the states of Michigan, Minnesota and New Mexico require a negative Tuberculosis test within 60 days of shipment

All cattle are required to have an ownership inspection (brand) prior to leaving the state of origin.

OUT-OF-STATE SHEEP AND GOATS

All sheep and goats are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and all rams require an entry permit number. All sheep and goats must have official scrapie identification. Sheep and goats from Oregon and Idaho on a round trip of 96 hours or less are exempt from the requirement of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, provided the Fair management furnishes veterinary inspection on arrival and rejects any unhealthy animals. For stays longer than 96 hours, they must meet the Washington state import requirements.

If lactating goats are entering, their milk must be discarded during any stay in Washington, unless they have been tested for Brucellosis and Tuberculosis.

OUT-OF-STATE ALPACAS LLAMAS

Llamas and alpacas are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. The exception includes those from Idaho and Oregon on a round trip of not more than 96 hours, provided the Fair management furnishes veterinary inspection on arrival and rejects any unhealthy animals.

OUT-OF-STATE POULTRY & PIGEONS

All poultry entering Washington State for exhibition purposes must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate) within 30 days of shipment.

All poultry entering Washington state for exhibition purposes must originate from a NPIP participant flock or be tested negative for pullorum-thyphoid, Salmonella enteritidis and avian influenza within 30 days of shipment.

OUT-OF-STATE HORSES

All horses are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, and horses over six months of age are required to have evidence of a negative test for (EIA) equine infectious anemia within six (6) months of entry.

Horses from Oregon and Idaho on a round trip of 96 hours or less are exempt from the requirement of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and EIA testing, provided the Fair management furnishes veterinary inspection on arrival and rejects any unhealthy animals

All horses are required to have an ownership inspection (brand) prior to leaving the state of origin.

OUT-OF-STATE SWINE

All swine are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and an import permit number, which may be the blanket permit number issued to that fair.

All swine six months and over must be negative to a Brucellosis test within 30 days prior to entry into Washington, except swine originating from a validated Brucellosis-free herd or state.

VEHICLE UNLOADING PROCEDURES

The Puyallup Fair is continually striving to make setup of merchandise and animal exhibits safer and more efficient. We are asking for your full cooperation in this safety program. **If you do not need to drive onto the grounds, please park in a Fair parking lot and hand truck or walk in.** When you have to drive in and unload, do so as quickly as possible and exit.

Security Check

Each vehicle entering the grounds will be subject to search prior to entering the grounds. Please enter designated Security Checkpoint Staging Area located at the Service Gate area. Expect delays.

Service Gate

Enter to receive vehicle permit to unload on grounds. You will be allowed one hour to unload and exit the grounds. Your pass will be date/time stamped. If you absolutely cannot complete your unloading in one hour, you must get the pass validated by a department superintendent or an administrative person.

Traffic Pattern

Follow the traffic patterns as established. Surrender the vehicle permit at the time you exit the grounds.

Fine

If you take longer than one hour and do not have validation for an extension, there is a parking fine of \$10.00 per hour.

During Fair Time

Concessionaires and sponsors with vehicles will be allowed through the Service Gate between 6:00 am and 8:30 am with a Service Road Vehicle Permit. You will receive your gate permit from the attendant at the gate. **NO** vehicles are allowed through the gate after 8:30 am. All vehicles must be removed from the grounds by 9:00 am. Vehicles left unattended and without a permit for parking past the allotted time will either receive a warning and be asked to remove the vehicle from the grounds or be towed away at the owner's expense. Do not park in front of doorways or in vehicle traffic lanes. Your vehicle may be towed away. **HANG VEHICLE PERMIT ON THE REAR VIEW MIRROR SO YOU CAN BE FOUND IN AN EMERGENCY. Include the building where you can be located and your cell phone number.** Please unload quickly and remove your vehicle from the grounds. **NO KEYS ARE TO BE LEFT IN MOTORIZED VEHICLES ON DISPLAY.**

STANDARD OF PERFECTION

All birds will be judged in accordance with the latest standards adopted by the leading specialty clubs of America and the NPA Standard of Perfection.

Open Class Pigeon entry forms are due and must be postmarked no later than August. 30, 2008, midnight. Entry fee will be \$2.00 per bird. The superintendent has the sole discretion to limit entries to capacity of barn.

IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT ALL BIRDS BE VACCINATED FOR THE PARAMYXOVIRUS AT LEAST 30 DAYS PRIOR TO THE SHOW.

OPEN CLASS PIGEON RULES

IMPORTANT

1. This show will be held from Monday, Sept. 8, 2008 through Thursday, Sept. 11, 2008. Your entry fee (\$2 per bird) must accompany your entry form. Make checks payable to The Puyallup Fair. Please include your phone number on the entry form. Entry fees are nonrefundable.

Please write separate checks for the Special Awards.

2. All exhibits must be in the Poultry Barn on Monday, September 8, 2008 between the hours of 6 am and 10 am. Entrance to the grounds is at the Service Gate on 5th Street SW (off of 15th Avenue SW).

NOTE: Arrangements may be made so birds can be dropped off on Sunday evening, September 7. Call the superintendent for details. The staff will vet check and coop the birds of exhibitors who have made this arrangement.

All prospective exhibits will be subject to veterinary inspection before cooping. Please check your birds for lice and other parasites before arriving at the show.

3. Birds CANNOT be removed until Thursday, Sept. 11, 2008 from 6 pm to 8 pm. Push carts, hand trucks, etc. will make pigeon removal much easier early in the evening. All birds must be in solid bottom cages. ONLY EXHIBITORS WITH 30 OR MORE ENTRIES WILL BE ALLOWED TO DRIVE ON THE GROUNDS. See the Superintendent for a special vehicle pass for the last night of the show. ANIMALS RELEASED TO A PERSON OTHER THAN THE OWNER MUST SHOW WRITTEN PERMISSION TO SHOW OFFICIALS.
4. Any person interfering with the judge or judging in any way will have their bird disqualified.
5. The superintendent or veterinarian shall have the right to refuse entry to the showroom, or to remove from the showroom any UNHEALTHY, UNSIGHTLY OR LOUSE-INFESTED EXHIBIT.
6. The greatest possible care will be given to all exhibits, but the management will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or

damage that may occur. Coops will be secured to insure against theft.

7. Whole grain feed will be provided for the birds.
8. Classes will be provided for all colors, when there is sufficient competition. At the judges' discretion, various colors of one breed will be grouped together to provide competition.
9. Exact color and pattern should be indicated on the entry form beside the breed description, i.e., Racing Homer, C. See example:

13. All young birds must be identified by a serially numbered, current year, seamless leg band of correct size. Old birds must have either seamless or split serially numbered bands. ALL BIRDS MUST BE LEG BANDED. Bands are available at Tradewinds, Inc., 2339 Tacoma Ave. S., Tacoma, WA, 98401

TEAMS

The Puyallup Fair Pigeon Show offers an opportunity for show team competition. Teams will be judged on their uniformity and perfection of variety.

1. A show team shall consist of five birds of the same breed, to include: one old cock, one old hen, one young cock, one young hen, and one bird of the exhibitor's choosing. Each team should be made up of only one color pattern, i.e.; a blue bar racing homer team, or red check racing homer team. An exhibitor may enter only one team of each color, NOT TO EXCEED EIGHT TEAMS OVERALL.
2. All birds in a team must be shown by one exhibitor.
3. All birds must be individually entered in breed classes to be eligible to take part in team competition.
4. Show teams must be so designated by band number at time of entry. Please be sure they are clearly marked on the entry form. Team judging will move much faster if the exhibitor can be present to carry their own birds.
5. A champion team will be chosen in each of the following areas: FANCY TEAM, SPORTING TEAM, AND UTILITY TEAM. ONE OVERALL GRAND CHAMPION TEAM WILL BE CHOSEN.
